






There's something that's not meant to be, and that's a duck with jewelry cause wearing necklaces and rings isn't good for a duck's wings.

#### Chapter 2 We Do Need More...








#### *Reader, it's time for you to state, What do you appreciate?*

#### Chapter 5 Ferd





Chapter 7 The Giving Ship



Chapter 8 **The Storm** 






And some time on the voyage back their mom and dad asked Jill and Jack, "What do you want for gifts this year? The holidays will soon be here."


and we will call it Giving Day."
