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PATIENT INSTRUCTIONS FOR SKIN TESTING

Extracts of common allergens are pricked or injected into the superficial layers of the skin. A positive reaction resembles a small insect bite and typically resolves within one-two hours. Positive and negative skin tests should be correlated with the patient's clinical history and exam.

Medications to be avoided 5-7 days prior:

Loratadine (Claritin, Alavert, OTC generics)

Medications to be avoided 4-5 days prior:

Azelastine nasal spray (Astelin) Cetirizine (Zyrtec and OTC generics) Chlorpheniramine (Chlor-Trimeton, Atrohist, Deconamine, Rondec, Rynatan) Desloratadine (Clarinex) Acrivastine (Semprex-D) Fexofenadine (Allegra) Hydroxyzine (Atarax, Vistaril) Levocetirizine (Xyzal) Olopatadine nasal spray (Patanase)

Medications to be avoided 3 days prior:

Azatadine (Trinalin) Brompheniramine (Dimetane) Carbinoxamine (Palgic) Clemastine (Tavist) Cyproheptadine (Periactin) Dexchlorpheniramine (Polaramine) Dimenhydrinate (Dramamine) Diphenhydramine (Benadryl) Doxylamine Ketotifen (tabs or eye drops, Zaditor) Meclizine (Bonine) Pepcid (famotidine) Phenindamine (Nolahist) Pheniramine

Medications to be avoided 3 days prior (list continued):

Promethazine (Phenergan) Tripelennamine (PBZ) Triprolidine (Triafed) Zantac (Ranitidine)

Over-the-counter Allergy, Cold, and Sleep medications

that may contain antihistamines: Actifed Advil PM, Allergy or Multisymptom cold Alka-Seltzer Plus Cold, Flu Allrest Comtrex Contac Coricidin Dimetapp Dristan tablets Drixoral Nyquil (Vicks) Robitussin Cough & Cold, Cough & Allergy Sine-Off Sudafed Allergy, Severe Cold, Nighttime Theraflu products Triaminic Tylenol Plus, Cold, Allergy, PM or Nighttime products Zicam Cold & Flu Unisom, Sominex, Simply Sleep And anything else containing an Antihistamine

Other medications to avoid prior to testing:

Tricyclic antidepressants: Elavil (amitriptyline), Sinequan (doxepin), Norpramin (desipramine), Tofranil (imipramine), Anafranil (clomipramine) and Pamelor (nortriptyline)...Avoid for 5 days prior.

H2 inhibitors (antacids): Pepcid (famotodine), Tagamet (cimetidine) and Zantac (ranitidine) ... Avoid for 2 days prior.

You should ask the doctor who prescribed these agents if it is safe for you to stop.

If you are on *Beta-blockers* or *MAO inhibitors,* please check with your allergist if you should stop them before testing. Your primary doctor and allergist may need to consult prior to testing.

Other medications such as **asthma inhalers** (Albuterol, Advair, Symbicort, Breo, etc), **Singulair**/montelukast, and oral steroids (Prednisone, etc) and nasal steroids (**Flonase**, Nasacort, Rhinocort) are all **ok to continue**. WHEN IN DOUBT, PLEASE CALL OUR OFFICE
