

A 1903 Indian, a bike believed to be the oldest American-made motorcycle, sold for \$155,000 as motocycles, cars, railway accessories and other items from the estate of Charlie Adler Jr., were disbursed at a Wolfe Industrial Auctions event in Frederick, Maryland.

"This motorcycle predates the Harley -- the bike most Americans associate with homegrown motorcycles," said Steve Rinker, an Indian motorcycle restoration specialist from Romney, West Virginia. "The handful of 1902 Indian models that were built were deconstructed, their parts used to build the 1.75-horsepower 1903 models. And as far as we know, this is the only unrestored 1903 still in existence."

"What makes this bike particularly intriguing is that it's never been restored. Except for a few nuts and bolts used for early repairs, this bike is all original," added Josh Ruby, the Wolfe auctioneer. "And I do mean 'bike.' This is one of the most primitive motorized vehicles you'll ever see -- a real peek into what innovation looked like over a hundred years ago."

For 30 years, the 1903 Indian was hung on a dentist's wall, and then was stored -- first in a garage and later in a basement. The bike has been owned by Adler's family since the 1950s.

# The "Getting to know the Members" section

This is an article about the Mossy Creek Cruzers' President, Larry Boggess. It was published in the newsletter from the company where he worked in North Carolina upon his retirement after 35 years of service. Larry, enjoy this retirement!







On Larry's last day at work, he showed up dressed like this instead of his steel toed shoes, etc. as a joke on everyone!

In the past years while still working, Larry Boggess' response to the question, "When are you going to retire?" has been quite accurate. He would immediately respond with the number of nights, days, hours, minutes and seconds remaining. Then it was finally zero night shifts, zero day shifts, zero hours, zero minutes and zero seconds. No more complicated math for Larry! Larry Boggess, originally from West Virginia, had never heard of Progress Energy (CP&L) before coming to the Carolinas. He met and married a girl from Asheville and they made their home there. He started looking for a job. He knew a guy who

worked at Carolina Power & Light. He said CP&L was a pretty good place to work, so Larry just "worried the crowd to death"

On November 24, 1975, Larry started his new job - which wasn't exactly what he expected. During his first day, his job was to beat tires off their rims. In those days, there weren't fancy machines to remove the rims from the tires - it had to be done with mallets and muscles. But, the good outweighed the bad. It was the first job he ever worked where he only worked three days and got a paid holiday off!

Larry was eventually transferred to Walters as Dam Attendant, and later to Walters Plant Operations. During his first days as operator, Bruce Medford taught Larry to maintain a questioning attitude. Larry would think he knew the answer and Bruce would seriously and repeatedly ask him "are you sure? Are you sure?" This frustrated Larry to the point that he was about to "throw down the hard hat." That skillful training method finally proved beneficial. Now, Larry will testify to Bruce's great training methods."

While working with the company, Larry has gone through several challenging events. He has endured two divorces, his first

son was born two months premature, torrential rains flooded his uninsured home, and a fire totally destroyed another home. During all these occasions, the Company had been there for him. The Progress Energy family supported him by giving him time, money, and helping hands with the various clean-ups.

He would miss the people more than anything else - especially those who worked in Hydro Operations.

Several people, including Larry, shared some little-known Larry Boggess stories: One night shift at the plant, Larry started hearing voices! He was concerned he was really losing his mind. As it turned out, those voices were just contractors working in the Walters Tunnel.


until they gave him a job at the Asheville Garage.
