## AUGUST 24th CAR SHOW to be held at Bush's Visitor Center

We also need volunteers to help with the door prizes. A car show committee will be organized and certain areas assigned to volunteers to get donations from. That way we won't be going to the same place twice. Hopefully a lot of you will volunteer for this, the more help we get, the less each of us will have to do!

Plan, if you can, to come to the horse arena and ball park on *Friday, August 23rd* and possibly *Thursday, August 22nd* to get the area ready and decide where the vehicles will go and where the food vendors and swap meet will be. Last year we had a great turnout for this and we hope we will have that many or more again this year. Anything that we need to take, ie: tables, chairs, tents, etc to the area before

the show. That way we can all drive our classic cars on the day of the show. We will have a place to store our tables, etc.,the night before.

The registration booth will also need volunteers the day of the show (and the day before) to learn the method of registering, collecting fees and assigning a vehicle number plus giving out the gift bags to the first 100 or 150, however many we decide on. If you have worked in the booth before you would not need to come for the training.

Hopefully we will have Robert and Billie Ferguson to run our sound system like they did last year. They did a great job!!

The day of the show will start for the members about 6 am. We usually meet at Hardees in Dandridge at 6 or 6:15 to eat breakfast and then go on over to start setting up at 7. A lot of the vehicles will arrive before the 9 am start time.

## Meeting held at Shoney's in Dandridge - March 5th, 2013

Attended by 50 members, 1 new member and 1 guest.

Gene Honeycutt said a prayer before the beginning of the meeting.

The meeting was started by President Larry Boggess. He welcomed our guest, and new members.

Pat Dukes read the minutes from the February meeting. Motion to accept was by Phil Hackman and the second came from Robert Cross. Accepted by all.

The February financial report was given by Gene Honeycutt and had a motion to accept by June Howerton with a second from John Jacobs. Accepted by all.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Old business started out with talk about the car show for this year. Glenn Allred had organized everything and had a poster with Bush's area drawn out on it. Pat Dukes had created a paper with both Bush's area and the Magnavox area on it and on the back of this sheet it had the pros and cons of both areas. Questions were asked for example: Will Bush pay for the photos, do we get vendors, and do we need port-a-potties at both places. All questions were answered. Gene Honeycutt made a motion that we stay at Bush's again this year. It was seconded by several people in unison. We had planned to have a ballot vote but it seemed that most everyone wanted to be at Bush's so a final decision was made to have it in the Ball park and horse arena at Bush's Visitor Center on August 24th from 9am to 3pm. A show of hands for it and no hands were raised to oppose it.

Bush's has agreed to furnish space and the electricity, allow us the use of their sound system, and purchase the dash plaques. There will be bath room facilities at the park as well as the restaurant. We can have a swap meet and have food vendors. The club will be in charge of judging the cars this year. It will be decided whether we do trophies or do the photos again. If anyone knows of people that would judge, please let Bud Morello or Glenn Allred know.

As the two years previously, we will need volunteers to help us on to make the show run smoothly. We will need several people in the parking lot to direct where the drivers can park. Also several people to work with Pat in the registration booth. Just let us know if you would like to volunteer. We need you!

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

New business included discussion of our weekly cruise-in. It had been mentioned that we should move it to where we would be more visible. A suggestion was next to McDonalds and Tractor Supply. There would be three places to eat there. Phil Hackman is checking on this for us.

A "Call System" was mentioned. This would be when something happened in the club and needed to be known by all members. Several members would be notified and then they would notify several members each by giving them a phone call. (UPDATE TO THIS: There are companies that will do this for you, you sign up and give them all phone numbers and they send a message out to each of the numbers registered. That way it would only be one person calling them but it would go out to all.) This will be checked out.

Pat mentioned three members that are sick that we know of. One is Henry Russell who is on dialysis. Next is Harold Tisdale who was very active in the club functions until he got sick. Also Charlie McDaniel who has been very active in the club but is not feeling well now. Our thoughts are with you, get well soon.

Jim and Lill Katzbeck talked to us about the Cruisin and Groovin Car Show that is in Dandridge on May 11th. There will be a charge of \$10 this year and trophies will be given. It starts at 9am and ends at 4pm. They also mentioned a play that is very good. See more about it in another part of the newsletter.

Pat told about a St. Patrick's Day event that will start out at the Smoky Stadium. At 12 noon (so come earlier) a parade will start, with police escort, and will travel down highway 66 into Sevierville to the DINER. A St. Patrick's Day celebration will be going on. It is a food drive so canned or non-perishable food is to be



brought by each driver and donated. It is being sponsored by the Diner Rats, the group that meets regularly at the Diner.

Some of the Committees need volunteers so if you can help with the charity committee or any of the other please let us know.
