
Dandridge Parade * December 19

The shirts will be a sand color with the club logo on the front on the top left and will be in three colors. The back will have the logo and the six advertisers and will be all black. The shirts will be ordered soon and will be given to each member.

Randall Anderson, who has specialty vehicle insurance spoke to us about the value of having your car appraised. Working with law enforcement, Child Protective Services, specially trained medical and mental health providers and the District Attorney General's Office, their goal is to make the process gentler and less traumatic to the children who have suffered so much.
