The end of the year will just be 10 months since we started in March of this year. The five of us met on many afternoons at Hardees in Jefferson City and we laughed a lot, were serious some of the time, and put our hearts into this new club. Each of us had been in other clubs and we discussed the good things about each of them and also the bad. We talked about having a large event each year and donating part of the proceedings to a charity which we had yet to designate.

We then talked to Gene Honeycutt about being our Treasurer because of his experience in several clubs around the area and we were so fortunate when he agreed to become one of our officers. He is definitely an asset to the club. He is the Chaplain of the Hamblen County Car Club and Public Relations Director.

We started talking to everyone we saw that had anything at all to do with cars and asked them questions about what they would like in a club and also if they would be interested in joining us. We had an end of summer picnic at Bud and Phil Morello's house at Baneberry and had 47 members attend. We held a benefit in Sevierville at the Diner for a church van wreck which we helped the family of a young girl that was killed as well as two other young people that were hurt in the accident that had long term injuries. We held a car show called "Fill the Truck with Toys" at the American Legion in Jefferson City to help the underprivileged children in our county. And also we put on a car show that we have had feedback on that was called one of the best car shows people had ever attended!! That was our Bush Visitor Center car show on August 25th. We had a great Thanksgiving dinner at Golden Corral with 72 members attending. On December 1st, we attended a benefit car show in Morristown that the Hamblen County Car Club put on. All of this plus our Friday night cruise-ins in Jefferson City and at Bush's Visitor Center. Whew...What a list of things we've done! *And this is only the beginning!*!

So what a year we've had!! To call our club a success is an understatement! I personally am so proud of the club and all the things we've done. It can only get better as time goes along.

With the coming of 2013, we would like to see the club grow even bigger and get better!! Re-enrollment will be coming up soon! This year the fee is \$20 but no shirts come with that this time unless you are a brand new member and then you will still get a Tshirt for you and your spouse/significant other.

Lets all chip in and give suggestions and ideas on what you would like for us to do and places that you would like for us to go. New committees will be set up in the new year.

Just remember, this club belongs to all of us and we all have a say in how we represent ourselves to this and surrounding counties. Our reputation is good now and growing better each day.

Meeting held at Shoney's in Dandridge - December 4th, 2012

Attended by 54 members and 2 guest.

The meeting was started by Vice-President Glenn Allred. Glenn welcomed our guests, welcomed new members and then Gene Honeycutt started our meeting with a prayer.

One of our guests, Jim Potts, is a Jefferson County officer, lodge 61, as well as the Criminal Justice teacher at the high school. Pat asked Jim to come to our meeting to explain the "Cop taking a child shopping" program. Jim explained that an officer takes a child to Walmart and allows them to spend approximately \$100 on anything they want. Walmart then feeds them dinner. The process of choosing these children is very intense and they make sure that the children are not getting help from somewhere else as well. Pat thought this would be a good place to help with a donation from our club. At first there were lots of questions and discussion about it, some suggesting that members had not been asked about Jim coming or about this charity. We had asked for suggestions but none were mentioned.

Pat studied the needs around Christmas and thought this would be a good place to donate but had Jim to come so he could explain it and then have the members vote on it. After Jim explained everything, we thanked him for coming and he left.

The November financial report was given by Gene Honeycutt and had a motion to accept by June Howerton and a second from Jerry Tipton. Accepted by all.

Due to the time factor of having our Christmas party after the meeting, Pat did not read the November minutes but will read them at the next meeting.

OLD BUSINESS:

Basically our old business was still discussing the donations that the club would be giving out. We agreed that at least \$1000 should be kept in the bank for money to put shows on with and other incidentals that come up. Most of the rest of it should be donated.

NEW BUSINESS:

It was brought up that Bill Miller, a loyal attendee of the cruise-in at Big Lots has passed away. Bill will be missed by lots of friends. Receiving friends was Thursday, December 6th.

Lots of discussion about the 501C3 or 5014C for non-profit groups. Gene has registered us as a non-profit group although not with the 501C3 because of the cost of it which is \$400 to \$600 dollars. Some of the members said that when they were soliciting donations for our door prizes that they were asked about our non-profit status. Others said no one had ever asked them anything.

We spoke of the committees we need for 2013 and lots of suggestions were made. For instance, Car Show Committee with someone being in charge, Activities and Events Committee to designate places for us to cruise to, eateries, and things for us to do together as a club. We definitely need a Charity Committee to find charities for us to donate to. We need a Door Prize and Solicitation Committee, a Membership Committee about how to recruit new members, Advertising and Promotions and Public Relations Committee. That should start us off right.

We will also be voting for Board of Directors so if you are interested in being on the board please let us know.

We spoke of charities again. The toys that we collected are going to be given to Christmas in Jefferson County, which gives them to underprivileged children.

Jane Kozial motioned that we give a total of \$1500, \$750 to the Christmas in Jefferson County and the other \$750 to the "Cop taking a child shopping program. John Abruzzo made the first to accept and Rick Tipton gave the second. It was accepted by the majority.

A couple of months ago it was brought up about the Officers and would we have new ones for 2013. It was voted on that the same Officers would remain in 2013 since they had not had a full year. It was motioned, and then a first and a second and passed by all.



There were 96 registered vehicles in all and 18 of them were Cruzer members. The following is the amounts that was collected: At Old Time Saturday - \$71.00, Bayou Seafood Show - \$54.50, the Muscle Car Museum - \$50.00 and the benefit car show - \$2495.25 with the benefit total being \$2670.75.

After June Howerton's expenses of \$440.80, we had \$2229.95 to be donated. Since the show flyer said it was for Courteney and others that were hurt in the accident, it was divided in the following way; \$1,000 towards Courteney's funeral and \$641.50 each to Kelsie Jones' family and Garrett Murrell's family to help with their medical expenses. They were both injured badly in the wreck.

We have received thank you cards from all of them.

We are so lucky to have a club SO CARING that we can help people out this way!


