### Cruising and Car Show Season!

Throughout the season, classic car cruise-ins draw lots of people a week, the reason, one person joked, is because "car people are kind of nuts".

Cruise-ins can be found nearly every day of the week and often offer more than just classic cars, with DJs and food vendors adding to the atmosphere of some of the cruise-ins.

In addition to weekly cruise-ins, annual events like the Mossy Creek Cruzers Car Show can draw 200 cars and lots of spectators.

Cars were a big deal to people who grew up in the 1950s and 1960s and still are. "People in it are in it for life."

In the case of many car enthusiasts, aging just means trading those younger years spent playing with Matchbox cars in the sandbox to taking their classic rides to a car show.

Each person has their own reason for attending these social gatherings comprised of grease monkeys and car nuts and depending who you ask, you'll get different answers as to what brought them there.

However, there is a common denominator. The attraction of muscle cars and the hot rods of yesteryear have come to define who these car owners are. Regardless of their age or race, car enthusiasts have become a tight-knit subculture of the American masses.

Each year, the Mossy Creek Cruzer Show brings in anywhere from 150 to 200 cars of all makes and models, from hot rods to import tuners.

There's a sense of camaraderie at the events. It's the people, it's getting to see other cars and getting a chance to take your car out and let other people enjoy it."

The shows and cruise-ins offer us a chance to chat with friends they've bonded with over their love of cars. They're usually nice people to begin with. We have been told that you never met a car guy who wasn't nice. The social aspect of the events is a strong appeal. It's the same interest, it doesn't matter what kind of car.

It is said that one of the reasons people are drawn to classic cars is because it was from a more flamboyant time in the industry, when people took pride in being different. Cars spell freedom for people. We are definitely a car-related culture. The nostalgia functions as a sort of fountain of youth. The cars keep us young.

For others car shows are a chance to share an experience with sons and daughters as much as an opportunity to reminisce about their own childhood. The children are already already talking about the day they can get their license and drive one of the cars to a show.

In the summer months, it's common for car owners to see the same groups of people at different shows and get to know each other and their vehicles and become true friends.

Typically you meet up with a bunch of your buddies and tell the same stories you told the last time you were together. It really becomes a tight-knit social group.

So get those cars out, don't just put them away in a garage and forget them. Drive them to one of your local cruise-ins and talk to people, trade stories and make lots of new friends!
