girl, in any price range, whatever you can afford.

There will be music and a classic car cruise-in/car show as well as food available for purchase from the Sons of the American Legion. The registration fee will consist of a toy or a monetary donation. All donations will go to Christmas in Jefferson County. Three trophies will be given for vehicle favorites and will be chosen by area people not associated with the club.

If it is cold weather, the American Legion will be available for warmth and also the food will

be available inside with places to sit, eat and get warm.

I know lots of charitable events are going on at this time of the year but our children are our future. Ideally, a child learns from a fairly early age how to be a wise contributor from having been a person that received help at some point in their life. June stated that only 45 cars attended that day with only a few Cruzers. The DINER has requested that the Mossy Creek Cruzers have this show again next year. June said that if you can't attend, you can bring non-perishable food to her at the meeting before the show or at any time. This is a great organization and we need to help. She said it will be on the second Saturday in October, 2014. So if you can't attend, please try to bring the food. The Food Bank reaches 18 counties in East Tennessee and is a wonderful organization.

Once again, it was discussed about our major car show for next year. A committee has been formed to decide if we stay at Bush's or if we try to find a new, larger venue. Glenn Allred said Carson-Newman College, Jefferson County High School, Jefferson Middle School, as well as Bush's has been mentioned. Another change should be the date. Last year there were a total of six car shows going on in the area the same day as well as the NASCAR race in Bristol. It hurt our show so we need to find a date that nothing else is going on. NOTE: It was brought to our attention that Bush's said we could use the whole field all the way down next to the parking lot as well as the horse arena and ball field if we decide to stay there next year. Nov. 16 The Hot Springs, North Carolina Volunteer Fire Department will be holding their annual car show on Nov. 16th, 2013 at the Hot Springs Resort and Spa grounds. Show begins at 10 AM and concludes at 3 PM. Door prizes will be given out on the hour and 3 trophies will be issued. Entry fee is \$10.00 per car and all proceeds benefit the Hot Springs VFD. The address is 315 Bridge Street, Hot Springs, NC 28743.

The bridge is out at the current time over the French Broad River on 25/70. You can take a county road that parallels the river and bypass it that way. That route is to come through Newport on 25/70 to the del rio community and turn right on 107. As soon as you cross the river, turn left onto Fugate road. This road has been improved from years past but it still has 3 one lane sections. If that way is not acceptable to members the only other way would be to go into Greeneville and follow Old Asheville Highway across the state line. Once in North Carolina it becomes highway 208. About 9 miles from the state line 208 will turn to the left, signs are present for this turn and direct towards Hot Springs. Around 3.5 miles from there you come to the intersection of 208 and 25/70. Turn left on 25/70 and come across the mountain into town. The resort grounds will be on the left after crossing the river bridge.




