Chocolate Butterscotch Haystacks

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 Cups of bittersweet chocolate chips
- 4 Cups crispy chow mein noodles
- 1 Pkg (10 to 11 ounces) butterscotch chips

DIRECTIONS:

- In a microwave or large metal bowl over simmering water, melt chocolate chips and butterscotch chips; stir until smooth. Gently stir in noodles.
- 2. Drop by rounded tablespoonsful onto waxed paper-lined baking sheets. Refrigerate 10-15 minutes or until set.
