




I received an email from "Rock Auto Marketing Department", an on-line parts store, wanting to know if they could send us something for our goody bags. They will send items to us the last week of this month.




# "FILL THE BOAT" FOR CHRISTMAS TOYS FOR CHARITY



#### **July 2012**

I've always been fascinated by 64 chevys. At the age of 16 I was driving a 1964 Chevrolet Impala hardtop; Baby # 1. It was daytona blue metallic, 327-250hp, 3 speed I thought it was really cool! At that age they looked hot with no hubcaps, with black rims or with baby moon hubcaps! I paid dad \$64.00 per month while working at Jack's Drive-in (started at age 14). It took all that and more to keep Baby going thru the years! By the time I foolishly traded Baby away in 1982 she used up 38 transmissions, 45 rearends, 2 engines, and Lord only knows how many clutches! By 1982, the only thing original was the main body hull and frame with the rear cross member being replaced. My best friends were area junk yard owners! After Baby, I would look at 64 Chevys trying to replace her memories and bring back the ole feelings. In 2004 I noticed a pitiful looking Bel-Air at John's Stereo, a project someone had started and stopped. Then one day a for sale sign was placed on it and I finally got the nerve to look. Needless to say, income tax time in 2005 saw me buy it with half the value of price in the trunk in new parts! I bravely took my 64 to my baby Sis's house, June, to hide from Lisa, being the brave man I am, (that's another story). Then June passed away Nov. 28, 2006 at the age 42 and 14 years my junior! We had been gathering parts all this time and we noticed a section in Classic Industries catalog that breaks down vin numbers. The Bel-Air had been manufactured in Doroville, Ga. in June of 1964, the same month and year my Sis, Junebug, was born! Getting the picture? The project became Junebug as Rick Michaels and I started reconstruction on February 14, 2008. The original plan was to redo Junebug back as she was made but memories of my Sis and Baby took over. Junebug kept plain in structure but all chrome and accessories that was available in 1964. Sis's favorite colors were added and finally December 28, 2008 I drove down Rick's drive as he wiped tears hating to see Junebug go! Tax time in 2009 saw the order for a special interior from C.A.R.S. Inc. Before the interior came in we had a little setback! FIRE!!! The carb caught fire and I was losing another Junebug! We managed to get the fire out with an extinguisher from the 4th police car at the scene. Yes. We have our own now! Rick went back to work and after replacing the hood (this is the 4th one) and other parts. Junebug came back to life in July 2009. February of 2010 (yep! Tax time) saw one of the best interior men in the business, Johnny Stines, finish Junebug's interior. We won 1st place at our first show and never felled to place in some category. We are very grateful. Junebug should be complete this winter when Randy Roberts completes a '64 327-300 hp engine that will make her thump with a teenagers heart! So thanks to Baby, Lisa (she also was born in 1964), Rick, Johnny, unlimited number of parts suppliers, income tax, Randy, and my Sis, Junebug, for my dream come true. So, when you see Junebug; you aren't seeing a restored vehicle; you are seeing a love that will never die!!!
