UPDATE TO THE APRIL MINUTES SUGGESTION:

It was discussed that we get estimates on liability insurance from two different insurance companies. Gene Honeycutt got an estimate for \$405 to \$450 per year through an insurance company in Morristown. Pat Dukes got an estimate from Elite Insurance Group in Knoxville for \$350 per year.

Since we need to have the insurance in place by the time the cruise-ins start, we went ahead and took out the insurance on Thursday, effective April 5th, and sent a check for the \$350 to The Elite Insurance Group.

It is for \$1,000,000 worth of liability coverage.

All though it is not required for a club to have insurance, it is better to be safe then sorry. Larry Boggess, Glenn Allred, Gene Honeycutt and Pat Dukes have a copy if anyone would like to see it.

What are Hot Rods?

The twenty years between 1945 and 1965 came to be known as the "Hot Rod Era" because the restoration of old cars became almost like the national sport of the United States. Everyone wanted a hot rod and that era spawned multiple different styles and types of hot rod cars.

"Hot Rod" is the name given to any vintage car, but it especially refers to a Ford that has been improved to enhance performance by reducing the weight of the vehicle. For this reason, most hot rods have minimalistic chassis with no roof, hood, windscreens or fenders. At times, the original engines of the car are also remove and replaced with lighter more efficient ones to raise the highest speed capacity of the vehicle. The modeling of a hot rod was considered a work of art and thus individuals loved to exhibit their re-done cars to the public. This generally happened at informal meets and short-distance, alleyway races until the year 1951. In this year, the National Hot Rod Association (NHRA) came in to existence to promote hot rod drag racing as a legitimate competitive sport. Apart from a racing event, what the NHRA really created was opportunity for hot rod car shows.



once had a 1955 Chevy, two door post, very nice car. It had a 327 engine and a four speed. At that time it was my daily driver. This was a different car from my March entry but was set up basically the same. There came a time when I was ready to get it upholstered and had a new straight seat to put in it. I had a gap cut out of the seat so could pull the seat up closer to the steering wheel so I could reach the gas, clutch and brake and still be able to change the gears. The seats were done in black rolled and pleated leather. I had the seats upholstered but friends were putting the seats back into the car.

lived in Knoxville and was used to driving in all the traffic but then came the day that I drove it to downtown Knoxville. I was on Neyland Drive and then turned up the hill, THE STEEP HILL, to get up to Gay Street, the main street in town. Now this wasn't just a hill, it was an extremely steep hill! About half way up, the traffic in front of one stopped so that stopped me, with a car very close behind me. So when it was my turn to go, I popped the clutch so as not to roll back any but then it happened!! My brand new seat that my friends had installed for me, came loose from the floorboard and slid back! That in turn made me go back and jerked my feet off of the gas, clutch and brakes. I slid down and got both feet on the brake so as not to go back into the car behind me and my arms were wrapped around the steering wheel trying to just hold on!! But now I'm in a prone position and can no longer see the street in front of me! The car behind me finally realized I was in trouble, as was he, if I ran into him, so he backed up and then went around me! When no one was behind me I slowly let off the brake and let the car roll against the curb, thus I could get it in gear and turn the motor off until I could get the seat pulled back up. I finally got the seat back up where it was supposed to be...sat there a moment contemplating how much worse it could have been...and waited till there was no traffic coming (just in case) and went on up the hill and on my merry way (until I would get into a different predicament with the car at another time).
