DRIVE OUTS

Classic vehicle processions typically move slower than the typical traffic, so if you are in one, maintain the speed of the group. *Stay close*. Don't put more than a car length or two between your car and the one in front of you unless you are on a highway. Stay in close line so other cars won't get in between the classics.

Here are 6 rules to follow if you are in a classic car procession:

Arrive early. You'll want to make sure you know the rules of the procession, so get to the starting point early enough to receive instruction.

Follow directions. Listen closely and follow their rules. If you miss something or don't understand, ask the person to repeat what was said.

Turn on your lights. You need to make sure your headlights are on before you get on the road. This is one of the ways other people know that you are part of the group. Typically the last car in the procession will stay in touch with the front car that is leading in case of a break down of one of the cars or a red light catching part of the group.

Follow the lead. Many classic car processions have police escorts, so stay in line behind the one in the front.

Don't speed. Caravan processions typically move slowly, so if you are in one, *maintain the speed of the group*. **Stay close.** Don't put more than a car length or two between your car and the one in front of you unless you are on a highway.

Stay in line. Don't try to take a shortcut to the destination. Most places give processions the right of way at intersections, so continue driving unless told to do otherwise.
