KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that the undersigned, the fee simple owner of the lands described herein, hereby constitutes and appoints _____ ("Proxy Holder") for and on behalf of the undersigned, to vote as proxy at the 2025 meeting of the landowners of the Coquina Water Control District and at any adjournments thereof, according to the number of the acres of unplatted land and/or platted lots owned by the undersigned landowner that the undersigned would be entitled to vote if then personally present, upon the election of members of the Governing Board. Said Proxy Holder may vote in accordance with his or her discretion for the position of Supervisor of the Board of Directors of Coquina Water Control District.

Any proxy heretofore given by the undersigned for said meeting is hereby revoked. This Proxy is to continue in full force and effect from the hereof until the conclusion of the landowners' meeting and any adjournments thereof but, may be revoked at any time by written notice of such revocation presented at the landowners' meeting prior to the Proxy Holder's exercising the voting rights conferred herein.

NOTES:

-All assessments must be paid. Landowners whose assessments for the previous have not been paid are not entitled to vote.

-Landowners owning less than 1 assessable acre in the aggregate shall be entitled to one vote. Landowners with more than 1 assessable acre are entitled to one additional vote for any fraction of an acre greater than $\frac{1}{2}$ acre. (Example: $1 \frac{1}{4}$ acres = 1 vote, $1 \frac{1}{2}$ acres = 1 vote, $1 \frac{3}{4}$ acre = 2 votes). Moreover, two (2) or more persons who own real property in common, that is one acre or less, are together entitled to only one vote for that real property.

-If the fee simple landowner is not an individual and is instead a corporation, limited liability company, limited partnership or other entity, evidence that the individual signing on behalf of the entity has the authority to do so must be attached hereto (e.g., bylaws, corporate resolution, etc.)
