Administrative Budget:

Supervisors Fees

Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 298 of the Florida Statutes, supervisor is entitled to \$50 per day for services rendered on behalf of the District. It is assumed the Board of Supervisors will meet at a minimum six times during the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 at a cost of \$150 per meeting, plus additional miscellaneous days and expenses.

Legal and Consulting Fees

It is anticipated that the legal and consulting expenditures for the coming Fiscal Year will not exceed \$_____ and will cover general legal representation and consulting fees of the District for the period. Litigation, non-reimbursed condemnation expense and review of contract documents necessary for the execution of work to implement the Plan of Water Management are included in this category.

Auditing

Pursuant to the provisions in Chapters 189 and 11 of the Florida statutes, the District is required to file certain audit reports with the Department of Veterans and Community Affairs, the State Controller, and the Auditor General. The financial reporting obligations require that an independent certified audit be conducted of the District's financial transactions. For this purpose, a CPA firm will be retained.

Accounting
