# Administrative Budget:

# Supervisors Fees

Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 298 of the Florida Statutes, supervisor is entitled to \$50 per day for services rendered on behalf of the District. It is assumed the Board of Supervisors will meet at a minimum six times during the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 at a cost of \$150 per meeting, plus additional miscellaneous days and expenses.

# Legal and Consulting Fees

It is anticipated that the legal and consulting expenditures for the coming Fiscal Year will not exceed \$43,000 and will cover general legal representation and consulting fees of the District for the period. Litigation, non-reimbursed condemnation expense and review of contract documents necessary for the execution of work to implement the Plan of Water Management are included in this category.

# Auditing

Pursuant to the provisions in Chapters 189 and 11 of the Florida statutes, the District is required to file certain audit reports with the Department of Veterans and Community Affairs, the State Controller, and the Auditor General. The financial reporting obligations require that an independent certified audit be conducted of the District's financial transactions. For this purpose, a CPA firm will be retained.

## Accounting

This segment provides for clerical and accounting at an anticipated compensation of \$39,000. Services to be provided, pursuant to engagements are:

- a) Preparation for and attendance at the meetings of the Board of Supervisors of the District, as needed.
- b) Such additional services as are pertinent to the above duties, as requested by the Board of Supervisors.
- c) Preparation and Administration of Budget.
- d) Monthly recurring accounting functions.
- e) Year end financial reporting to the State of Florida.
- f) Assisting District's Auditor in the preparation of the annual audit and financial statements.
- g) Monthly assessment collections and accounts payable.
- h) Additional services provided.

# REGULAR MEETING MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF COQUINA WATER CONTROL DISTRICT AUGUST 14, 2020

Pursuant to published Notice, the Board of Supervisors of Coquina Water Control District (the "District") held its regular meeting on Friday, August 14, 2020, at the District office, located at 17429 NW 242<sup>nd</sup> Street, Okeechobee, Florida 34972.

Present at the meeting was Supervisor Michael Vincent, Supervisor David Law and Supervisor, Robert Stark.

Engineer, Bryan Clemons and Superintendent, Howard Sensaboy, were also present.

# ROLL CALL

Mr. Stark called the Board of Supervisors meeting to order at 9:05 a.m.

# ESTABLISHMENT OF A QUORUM

Mr. Stark announced that a quorum was present and that it was in order to consider any business to properly come before the Board.

Mr. Stark stated that Attorney Fitzpatrick has filed the Motion for Summary Final Judgment in the case of Coquina vs. Okeechobee Sheriff and we should have a court date soon.

# ACCOUNTANT'S REPORT

Mrs. Williams was not present.

# ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Mr. Fitzpatrick was not present.

## **ENGINEER'S REPORT**

Mr. Clemons presented the board with his monthly report (a copy of which is on file at Wicks Brown Williams office).

Mr. Clemons stated a Contract with ECF was previously signed to survey for the presence of gopher tortoise burrows. The board stated they want to use a different company. Mr. Clemons stated he will check on the terms of the Contract that was already signed with ECF.

# SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Sensaboy stated he has completed another two miles of road repair.

Mr. Sensaboy stated landowner Frank Acostas wants to know if Coquina will trade lots with him. The board discussed this and unanimously agreed they cannot trade lots.

Mr. Sensaboy asked what the board wants to do with the old shed, which held Coquina's records. The board instructed Mr. Sensaboy to take it to auction.

Mr. Sensaboy stated the security cameras at the shop are no longer working. He obtained a proposal for new cameras and an updated system and it is \$4200.00. The board discussed same and asked Mr. Sensaboy to obtain a quote for 360° cameras.

Mr. Sensaboy stated he has checked with T-mobile with regards to the new tracking system & it will be \$165 month for all the equipment. A landowner suggested using Street Eagle, as they run off a satellite and you never lose signal. Mr. Law made a motion to sign up with this company for service on the tracking system. Mr. Stark seconded that motion and same was unanimously passed.

Mr. Sensaboy asked the board if they want him to hire another employee. He stated he already has an application for an experienced tractor driver. Mr. Stark made a motion for Butch to hire an additional employee. Mr. Vincent seconded that motion and same was unanimously passed.

Mr. Sensaboy stated he is still installing the gates and his goal is to have them all installed by the September board meeting.

# **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Jerry Hawkins asked why the culverts along Peavine were removed. Mr. Clemons explained it was because of a flawed system and needing to reroute the water.

# APPROVAL OF MINUTES & WARRANTS

Mr. Stark made a motion to approve the Warrants and Minutes from July 2020. That motion was seconded by Mr. Law and same was unanimously passed.

The next regular board meeting is scheduled for September 11, 2020, at the District office. This meeting was adjourned at 9:53 a.m..
