

# LARGE LANGUAGE MODEL STUDY PROMPTS

## 1. Say What You Want Clearly

Don't be vague. Ask for exactly what you need.

✓ "Explain fractions like I'm 12."

✗ "Tell me about fractions."

## 2. Give the Backstory

Tell the LLM what you're working on so the answer fits.

✓ "I'm revising GCSE History – can you explain trench warfare?"

✗ "What's trench warfare?"

## 3. Choose the Format

Decide how you want the info: a list, a summary, a story?

✓ "Give me 5 key facts about the Cold War in bullet points."

✗ "Tell me about the Cold War."

## 4. Pick the Tone & Who It's For

Say if it should sound casual, serious, or funny.

✓ "Explain photosynthesis in a funny way for Year 8 students."

✗ "What is photosynthesis?"

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## STUDY PROMPTS

### 5. Set Limits or Goals

Give a word count or a focus.

✓ “Summarise Macbeth in 100 words focusing on Lady Macbeth.”

✗ “Tell me about Macbeth.”

### 6. Ask to Improve It

If you don't like the answer, just ask for better!

✓ “Can you make that easier to understand?”

✓ “Can you add more detail?”

### 7. Show What You Like

Give an example so it knows what style you want.

✓ “Make a slogan like this: ‘Drink smart. Stay sharp.’”

### 8. Split It Up

Break big tasks into steps.

✓ “Help me revise Macbeth in 3 parts: plot, characters, themes.”
