WELCOME HOME

Guidelines for the celebration of Mass include the sacredness worthy of the Word and Eucharist and common good of the participants

Arrive early for Mass to accommodate safe distance needs. A facial covering or mask is recommended but not mandatory.

Maintain safe distance guidelines as you enter and leave the church.

Deposit your Offertory Envelope or donation in the container at each entrance.

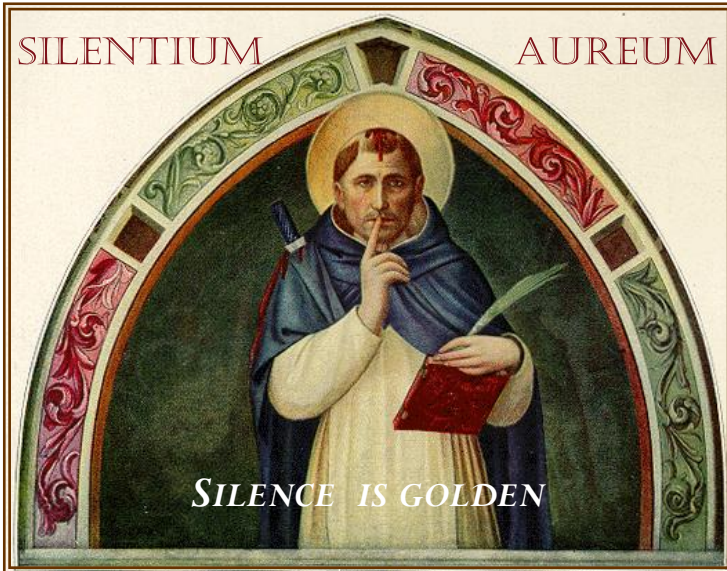
Pews are marked **Individual** or **Family** (which is couple and/or multiple family members). Enter from the side aisle and move to the center to allow others to be seated.

Holy Communion will require safe distance as you move in single file to receive Holy Communion in the hand or on the tongue. Briefly remove any facial covering, mask or gloves.

Refrain from leaving prior to dismissal of Mass as this affects others by safe distance and exposure issues.

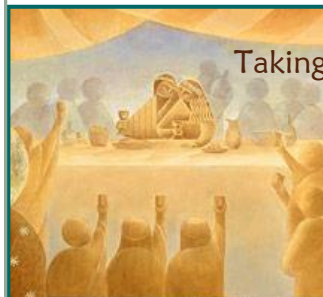
