The Corvette Pipeline... Spring Has Sprung–Things to Check on Your Vette!

Give the tires a good gander and check the pressure. Look for any anomalies from setting for an extended period of time. Look for dry rot. Replace if necessary.

Charge that battery. If a tender was used—check the charge on the battery and hook the cables back up checking for any corrosion.

Check all fluids. Look for any leaks and make sure all fluids are topped off. If your Corvette has been idle for more than a year, change the oil. Take a look at your hoses and belts to ensure they are in good condition.

Check the spark plug wires.

Firing that baby up. Start your Corvette. Do not rev the engine—I know, I know, just resist. Let the engine idle and come up to temperature. Watch all gauges to make sure everything is as it should be—oil pressure, coolant temperature, amperage. Take the Vette out around the neigh-

borhood for a little cruise. Check the braking by stopping several times. This should remove any moisture that may have accumulated while storing. When you return to the casa check the engine once more for leaks or any other anomalies.

Okay, you should be ready to roll! Shine that baby up with your favorite detailing spray and polish those wheels. Fill it up with some fine premium fuel and it is time to head out to your favorite little two lane and eat up some pavement!


