
Rick Poepping and others have resurrected the OCC Facebook Page and it seems to be working flawlessly. Go to the page and check it out!

This year's Hall of Fame inductees have been announced: Dollie Cole (wife of Ed Cole): Dollie gained a reputation as a respected business woman and staunch defender of the automobile industry. April 2019 Meeting Minutes.....

Kendall welcomed everyone and gave the floor to Kenny Schaeffler who introduced Brian Eskridge, Owner of Blue Line Auto Detail.

Brian, a St. Louis County Police Officer, told the membership about CQuartz Professional, an industry leading premium ceramic coating. He explained in detail the process of the application and work that goes into the process. First they clean the finish, then decontaminate the surface, then paint correction/leveling the paint is done. Next is refining by polishing the surface to a mirror finish. And lastly the CQuartz Professional coating is ap-

plied leaving a perfect surface. The finish will no longer need any washing other than rinsing with clear water. No waxing, No clay bar process. Only an occasional detail spray that he provides is all that is required. Brian said he has processed about 1200 cars of all types and models and has never had one returned. Thanks to Brian for the presentation. It seemed that there was quite a lot of interest after the meeting. Kendall then told the group that Mike Orzell had just completed 'Tuning School' and that he might be doing a presentation in the near future.

Kendall then introduced Dennis Osterhorn, OCC Treasurer, and he submitted the treasurer's report. Dennis stated he had paid for the Blackhawk Shelter at J..B. Park for the upcoming picnic in September. He had also paid the club insurance and the club


