
Kendall Willis made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Cheryl Osterhorn seconded the motion.

The idea of a <u>mid-engined</u> <u>Corvette</u> is not new. In fact, it was 60 years ago this year when the first functioning prototype based on that very idea was put together. Known as 1959 CERV I (Chevrolet Engineering Research Vehicle), this open-wheel single-seater rocket was the brainchild of Zora Arkus-Duntov, a Belgian engineer of Russian descent who joined <u>Chevrolet</u> in 1953, just after the birth of the first Corvette.
