There was no old business to discuss at the meeting.

Richard from Hagerty Insurance made a presentation on the options that Hagerty offers for Corvette and collector car insurance.

Coming from a 'Car Family" he says he understands the lifestyle of the Corvette Enthusiast.

His specialty line of insurance is typically 30-40% less expensive than traditional insurance.

It is a no hassle process that is done completely online. There are no appraisals or stated amounts.

Hagerty has a team of professionals that collect data from all across the world. They attend auctions to ascertain car value data creating their 'Evaluation Tool'. You and

the company will have an agreed/guaranteed value on your car. If your car were to be totaled or damaged they will pay the agreed to amount—no questions.

There is no mileage cap as long as you do not use the vehicle as a daily driver. That being said you are allowed to drive the car to and from work for a maximum of 5 months per year.

Other drivers must be 16 with a clean driving record to be covered on the vehicle

The claims department is very knowledgeable as all they deal with is collector cars and understand the emotional attachment to your baby. They also have contracted agreements with towing companies to assure your car is handled with the care it should be on specified flat bed trucks with soft straps.

They will also pay you directly for labor performed on the vehicle if you wish to repair it yourself

Another perk available is membership in the Hagerty Drivers Club. You receive the Hagerty magazine with articles by Jay Leno and other notable car collectors and experts. The magazine is the 3rd largest automobile magazine in the country.

Hagerty also sponsors functions and parties for their members. One was recently held at Fast Lane in St. Charles.

They also insure new cars, not just antique or vintage cars.

Steve Willis offered that Hagerty also offers 'Track Day' insurance. Just in case you 'Feel the Need for Speed'!

Hagerty also sponsors events and fundraises for many children's charities.

There were several folks in the OCC that currently have Hagerty Insurance and they all said how great it is.

As many of you know the NCM has banners displayed throughout the year. The OCC is going to have its first banner next year. The banner has to be submitted by February 28, 2020. The size of the banner is 29.5 inches by 60 inches, so they are fairly large. Put your creative thinking caps on and design a banner or get together as a group and design one.

The NCM is auctioning off a 1968 Corvette on EBAY. It includes a museum delivery. Right now the bid is \$17,000. Bid now and often.


