PRESIDENTS OPENING STATEMENT HAPPY VALENTINES DAY

Thank you all for coming out tonight.

Welcome back to Saucy's.

Membership Dues need to be paid by end of February.

We had our annual Executive board meeting on January 23. A number of things were discussed that evening.

I presented information about acquiring an Employer ID Number (EIN) that could possibly help with situations like banking, insurance, various accounts that need to have officers changed from time to time. The banking especially. When Sharon Young termed out of the Treasurer position, the bank informed us, that to put Sid Hirsch on the account as Treasurer, it would be necessary to close the current account and open a new one. With an EIN, that would not be necessary. It is just a matter of updating officers. There was a lot of concern about tax filing with the EIN. I was told that in a case like ours it's pretty much a post card form online. Should not be a big deal. I am still having conversation with the accountant getting questions answered so I can provide the best information to the Board, as well as the members.

We talked of relocating our Post Office Box to Fenton. We have had issues with the current Post Office in removing past members names and sending invoices to past members that are no longer in the Club. We can eliminate that with the relocation. I was told that any unused portion of the term of boxholder would be transferred to the new account. Currently, Dennis is listed as the owner of the account. Dennis has also taken charge of other accounts like GoDaddy and Insurance Policy. I believe with the EIN, these accounts can be handled by officers and easily updated.

We discussed how to get more members involved in Club activities, and volunteering to organize or chair events and/or Club functions.

We discussed ways to increase revenue for the Club to help cover some of the costs for things that the Club covers. One suggestion was to put on a Trivia Night Fundraiser. It was discussed that we could charge a minimal fee (\$10) per person and also have 50/50. It was suggested that we could also have prizes to raffle. I checked with a local company that Emcees trivia nights and they do a great job. Their charge is \$525 and they provide the person asking questions, tallying scores, music, video of the questions and answer sheets. Arch Rivals Company is very professional in their presentation.

It was suggested to have a couple planning meetings per year. To put together schedules for the year, determine organizers and volunteers, and also to put together other events like day trips, fun runs, etc.

The final item discussed was dues and the possibility of a small increase to help cover the increased costs for the club to do business. For instance, the 2023 picnic costs were up about 10% over 2022. The same hold true for the Christmas Party. So, we need to get more people involved in putting together revenue events, raise dues slightly or reduce the costs of these events.

And as always, if we have the chance to support our sponsor, please do. Butler has a parts department and offer full service on all your cars.

Thank you again for your support and together we will make 2024 a spectacular year for OCC.

New Board Members


