





The meeting was called to order at 7:31 pm by President Ken Schaeffler.

Ken introduced the Club officers and volunteers.

Ken presented his opening statement – Please read the Presidents Report.

Ken presented the Honorary Member framed certificates for Byrle Layman and Don and Judi Delonjay.

He announced the new location for the next meeting in May. It is the Dogwood Social Club on Manchester Road. He announced that we have 42 members in attendance this evening.






