Meeting Minutes- Original Corvette Club of St. Louis February 2022



The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by Sgt. At Arms Tom Nickelson.

The Pledge of Allegiance was reluctantly forgone because of space restrictions.

President Kenneth Schaeffler welcomed everyone and introduced the officers and volunteers for the OCC.

President Kenneth Schaeffler gave his opening statement. (See the President's Report)

Treasurer's Report-Sharon Young

The floor was then given to Treasurer, Sharon Young. Sharon gave the treasurer's report in detail. She relayed Jim Butler Chevrolet had once again given their generous support for 2022. She also reported the OCC had changed banks from The Bank of America to Commerce Bank. A motion was made by Cheryl Osterhorn to accept the Treasurer's report. It was seconded by Rich Brewer.

All makes/models are welcome to register for open track as usual. This registration is for open track for Novice, Intermediate, and Advanced classes.


We run 4 Classes to provide minimal traffic throughout the day each class is capped at 30 drivers:


