

Meeting Minutes- Original Corvette Club of St. Louis March 2022



The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by President Kenneth Schaeffler.

<u>Sgt. At Arms Tom Nickelson</u> then led the membership in the Pledge of Allegiance. Karen Mericle brought in a flag

for the pledge.

President Kenneth Schaeffler welcomed everyone and introduced the officers and volunteers for the OCC.

President Kenneth Schaeffler gave his opening statement. (See the President's Report).

Ken then turned the floor over to Larry Dann for a special guest. Larry briefly explained that the OCC has a great opportunity to participate in association with the Pacific Partnership of Pacific, MO for their annual car show. Larry introduced Loyd Harris from the Pacific Partnership. Loyd explained how the car show was in its 20th year. He also said that the show normally attracts 400-500 show cars every year. The Partnership is a charity based organization that assists with the revitalization of Downtown Pacific by operating several events throughout the year. They host the Iron Horse Rodeo, parades, and other events. He told us that the Partnership will donate TWO- \$1000 scholarships to local students, in the name of the OCC for their education in the auto tech field. He explained how the show cars are to be judged upon entry/registration to the show on Columbus Street. There are 3 blocks cordoned off on this 50 foot wide street for us to do so. We will need tables, pop up tents, cones, etc. to handle the registration. Registration will begin at 8am and run until noon. They are hoping to have the winners announced as soon as 1 pm or 2 pm at the latest. This is a family oriented event with food vendors and other vendors of all types. There will be a Dyno Chassis if you want to see how much your Corvette is putting out! We will have special parking and space to set up our banner and an information booth if we wish to do so. Our Corvettes will have to be judged by another group. The car show turns into a street party later in the day followed by a huge fireworks display from the bluff above Downtown. The date is JUNE 25. We need volunteers please.

<u>Sharon Young-Treasurer</u> Sharon gave the Treasurer's report. She said that she had sent the \$500 fee for th OCC banner at the NCM. She also said because of the terrible weather we had in February that deposits had been taken to the bank which she will do as soon as possible.

He now has to go through healing and therapy to heal the broken bone.

On Saturday February 12th we picked up our C8 Z51 3LT Corvette at Corvette Museum (NCM) in Bowling Green, Kentucky. It was a long wait to get to that point. It started with finding a dealer that sold at not play games with add-ons at delivery. We put down a \$1,000 posit in March and then another deposit with a second dealer in started the long waiting process. Finally in November we received we were assigned an allocation. At this point we submitted our final dealer along with another \$5,000 non-refundable deposit.

Our C8 was built on January 26th and the dealer immediately contacted us for full payment before it was out of Quality Control. We arranged pick-up on Saturday morning, February 12th to take delivery. We drove to Bowling Green on Friday, toured the Museum and were able to see them bring out our Red Metallic Mist (RMM) C8 "Ruby" and put her on display on Corvette Row.



If you have never been to the NCM, it is definitely worth the drive. Unfortunately, the tours of the Corvette plant have been halted for the past several years. We do recommend staying at the Hotel Sync which is right across from the NCM. It is a quirky hotel and the owner Preetesh Patel makes the best coffee and latte's in the morning. The hotel has 4 enclosed garages that you can rent separately for \$30/night to park your Corvette safely.

We arrived at 7:45am on Saturday at the NCM and went over all of the sales paperwork and documentation. Then our personal concierge took us out to our car and did an orientation of the car. It is a very complicated machine for sure and I can tell you that I have forgotten most of the information she told me. After a couple of hours of this orientation we took a break to shop at the Museum store. There is no way you can visit the store and not purchase something! When the orientation was completed, the Concierge put the top down on our beautiful new C8 and she drove it of the museum out with me in the passenger seat. It was fun



Corvette Trivia!!

An argument developed between Bill Mitchell and Zora Arkus-Duntov over the now-famous split rear window in the 1963 coupe, favored by Mitchell. It was removed the next year and never seen again. A total of 10,594 split-window coupes were produced in 1963.
