





Fix It Corner.....

I recently had a learning experience at the end of this years St. Louis auto show. After having my C6 Grand Sport on display at the show for 4 days and having the doors, windows, trunk lid and hood open during show hours I attempted to start it to no success. I had run down the battery enough that I couldn't start the car. Thankfully Jason Messenger had a booster box and I was able to start my car. But, as I got ready to leave I attempted to put the top up on my car. I stress "attempted" as I could not get the top to operate!!

As I looked around for some assistance I saw that everyone else had left, but to be fair it was only after they saw that my car did start and was running. For the life of me I could not figure out why the top wouldn't operate! Well I had little choice but to drive the 25 miles home with the top down. While it was bad luck that I couldn't close the top I was VERY fortunate that the temperature that night was a balmy 58*! This was January 30th, not only was it 58 but it wasn't raining or snowing that night a triple blessing. So I drive home with the top down, now there were a few folks that did double takes as I went cruising on by, and yes Byrle I did "wave". So all in all I was very lucky, weather wise.

What I later found out about some cars from 2005 thru 2017 is that if your battery dies or you replace the battery you need to "index" the windows. The window indexing feature has been around many years on high-end vehicles such as BMW, Lexus and Mercedes, and obviously Corvettes.

Window indexing is used to lower the window approximately 1/8" when the door is opened. This allows the top edge of the window to clear the window weatherstrip that it's seated into. Once the door is closed the window will raise into its fully sealed position. If you have a convertible you may find that the top will not go up or down until the windows have been indexed correctly. Indexing came about with the C5 and earlier generation of Corvettes which had a constant problem with water intrusion and wind noise, but with window indexing a complete weatherproof seal can encompass the window by allowing the window to fit into a groove built into the window gasket.

Now that I shared my tale of woe and some history here is how you "index" the windows. Sorry Mike Koenen but this procedure will NOT require any Windex(ing)!!

Get into the vehicle and make sure both the driver and passenger doors are closed.

Turn the ignition switch to the On position, but with the engine off. On some Stingray models it has been found that you may need to start the engine to get this procedure to work. I indexed my windows with the car running and it worked just fine. Start with the driver-side and put the window all the way down then back up. Now put the passenger-side window down then back up.

Hold the driver-side window switch up for 3-5 seconds and then release the switch. For a second time hold the driver-side window switch up 3-5 seconds and then release.

Repeat this process for the passenger-side window.

To make sure the windows have indexed correctly, check your windows to see if the windows lower 1/8" when opening and that they go up when you close the doors. Now raise and lower both windows to ensure they work properly. At this time you should also be able raise and/or lower the convertible top!

I later checked my Owners Manual and sure enough Window Indexing and Power Window Initialization was right there on page 2-18 (of my manual)!! But then Corvette owners don't read instructions, right??

Wil Cooksey - former Corvette Plant Manager and current Hall of Fame Member.

Wil Cooksey set the standard for all Corvette Assembly Plant Managers afterwards to build upon. As an enthusiast himself, he brought a love for the Corvette to the job along with an engineering background and his natural leadership ability to take the Corvette to the next level. Together with the United Auto Workers Union, a bond was formed between labor, management and the owners of these cars that remains strong and unbroken to this day.

Retired since 2008, he remains connected to the people and the car he loves. He is a familiar face at the National Corvette Museum where he once served as Chairman of the Board, and you'll often find him in the middle of crowds at Corvette events all over the country. 
