Thank you again for your support and together we are on our way to a great 2023 and I look forward to seeing you all at the Christmas Party.



The 2024 Corvette E-Ray is Competing for Road and Track's Performance Car of the Year

One of the most consistently great stories in this cornucopia of high-revving joy comes from our friends at Road & Track. Their <u>Performance Car of the Year</u> has become one of the world's best proving grounds for the industry's hottest new enthusiast driving machines. Since the headlining event's inception in 2013, the Chevrolet Corvette has been the most successful nameplate at PCOTY, taking home top honors with the <u>2014 C7 Stingray</u> and <u>2019 C7 ZR1</u>. It also enters 2024 with the <u>2023 C8 Z06</u> reigning as the defending champion!

Format Change Alert! This particular super test has been split into over and sub-\$100k groups so that the writers don't have to stretch everyone's imagination by comparing a WRX with a McLaren 765LT. This amendment will also save R&T editors from another situation where they end up picking a <u>Hyundai for the blue ribbon</u> over cars that no sane person would pass over for said Korean hatchback.



Defending the Corvette's crown in the new heavyweight (over \$100,000) division will be the first-ever all-wheel-drive, hybrid Corvette, the 2024 E-Ray. The only other semi-reasonable competitor meeting the \$143,115 Corvette this year will be the \$128,290 manual transmission Porsche 911 Carrera T.

In the low-brow league where the E-Ray wishes it more closely adhered to the Grand Sport's old pricing strategy, we'll see the \$75,345 BMW M2, the Acura Integra Type S, which at \$52,595 is the test's most attainable offering, and the shockingly expensive one-two punch of the Mustang Dark Horse and the Nissan Z Nismo with respective stickers of \$71,585 and \$68,280!





Our Mission

The mission on the National Corvette Museum is to educate worldwide audiences on the evolution of the Corvette – America's Sports Car – through collection, preservation and celebration of its legacy.

Our Vision

The Museum will be recognized as the epicenter of the Corvette community's enduring spirit, serve as the preeminent repository for this American icon, and operate with uncompromising standards while remaining focused on strategic growth that ensures our financial future.

Do you love the Corvette? Are you interested in its legacy? Or is it just a car that you like because of how it looks? This is what I wonder.

Let's start with a fun thing, a good-hearted thing.

The NCM has a program where anyone can sponsor a field trip for a Class or a whole school of kids to the Museum. While I was there, they had a whole school of kids Pre-K thru 6th grade for a field trip. I saw them coming through in their nicely formed single file lines and later heard them while they could have free reign in the new education center (it's walls are shared with the Chevrolet theater where the Ambassadors were meeting.). You could hear the enthusiasm! Lol. These are Title 1 schools that center on economically disadvantaged students.

Club Parking Banners

Parking Lot Banner Program will be going up in 2024 to \$725. This is an increase of about 45%. The Museum has not raised the cost of the Banner Program for a decade. The last price increase in 2014 was also a 45% increase at the time.

As we are all aware, costs are rising in the current economy. With this understanding, combined with the extreme popularity of this special program along with 2024's Caravan Year upon us, it was decided to move forward with the increase. In 2023, we unfortunately had to turn clubs away that wanted to purchase a banner, as we sold out of spots in just three weeks. It really is a great program. Folks are seen looking at the banners all the time in the parking lots, and when clubs come to visit, they often take a group photo with their banner. It is certainly a show of pride in your club and what it represents, and it also supports the Museum and our efforts as well.

*** The 2024 Banner Program will open via an email announcement sent to our Ambassadors in mid-January and *not before*. As always, orders will then be taken on a first-come, firstserved basis.

The 7th National Corvette Caravan is slated for August 29-31, 2024.

Often referred to as the world's largest moving automotive event, the National Corvette Caravan is a celebration of America's Sports Car, culminating in Bowling Green, Kentucky for the anniversary celebration of the National Corvette Museum. Hosted only once every five years, the next event is slated for Labor Day Weekend 2024 and will mark the Museum's 30th Anniversary. Registration is open. (Talk about the differences of how details will be added over time.)

Kansas and Missouri – 2024 National Corvette Caravan



Corvette Trivia

Corvette Pioneered Wraparound Windshields

The 1953 Corvette came stock with a wraparound, or panoramic, windshield – the first mass-production car to do so. These became wildly popular during the 1950s, but were later abandoned due to distortion concerns. Other issues also existed with this type of windshield, including a weaker roof structure due to the lack of supporting pillars. Therefore, they were gradually phased out over the course of the next few generations of Corvettes.
