

SANTA'S HELPERS will be on us soon. This usually occurs at the November meeting, so get your Christmas shopping done early and let's put together a great bunch of toys and other donations. I will contact Rita to have them pick up at the November meeting.

I want to talk about this years Jim Butler Annual All Chevy Car Show. Before I talk about it, I would like all of the members that helped out to stand up and be recognized. I want to personally thank each and everyone of you for a spectacular job. I also sent an email to Jeanne Walk from the Gateway Camaro Club thanking them for their help and support. We learned a lot from last years show. We raised the entry fee for judged cars to \$25 from \$20 last year. We also had a fee of \$15 for Display only cars. Registration went so smooth, thanks to members suggestions. Asa driver entered, we collected their money, gave the a registration form to fill out and place on their dash board for the judges to pick up. Each car, registered and display was given a numbered sheet with a car number for the peoples choice award and the Sponsor Award. I also hired "The Give Back Pack" to independently judge the show this year. If you recall, last year members gathered various prizes for the raffle and we drew tickets from the same tickets sold for the 50/50 drawing. We changed that up this year also. The 50/50 drawing was separate from the prize raffle, selling two sets of tickets. Members from both Clubs solicited various gifts, but OCC members really went above and beyond. Some of the prizes were a round of golf for 4 w/cart (Value \$192.00). A \$250.00 gift certificate from Fairway Automotive. A \$175.00 gift Card for Johnny's Hideout in High Ridge. A gift certificate for the Lodge at Grants Trail w/ breakfast the next morning (\$205.00 value). Jim Butler donated A service pack including 4 oil changes, 4 tire rotations and a wash and detail bucket. (\$550.00 value). Premier window Tinting donated a window tint certificate (\$450.00 value). Members donated wine, booze and food baskets. A hand-made quilt was donated, as well as a pair of silver Corvette earrings and an original painting that I really wanted, but didn't win. Plus a lot of detail buckets and food and beverage gift cards. Overall there were over 40 prizes raffled off.

To recap, last year we had our best show to date and we raised \$3,141.00 for Boys and Girls Club of greater St. Louis. And we did that with 4-1/2 weeks to set it up. Last year we had 9 classes w/ 1st, 2nd & 3rd place award plaques as well as 'Best in Show', 'Peoples Choice" & 'Sponsor Pick' for a total of 30 awards presented.

Well, this year we had 6 months to prepare and I said "We can do better than last year" We added 5 more classes and "Best Club Participation" award this year for a total of 46 awards presented. I also said "wouldn't it be great if we could do \$5,000.00 this year?". I was hopeful, but really didn't think it could happen at the time. Well, with the help of the members that stood up earlier, we sold \$655.00 in 50/50 tickets. The winner took home \$327.00. We sold \$1,014.00 in prize raffle tickets. And registration took in \$3,694.00. This years check to 'Boys and Girls Club of Greater St. Louis' will be \$5,036.00. I couldn't be more pleased with the results and the efforts put forth by the OCC members that worked their tails off to make the day a huge success and the best Butler Show to date. This may be tough to top next year, but it's possible.



2024 Corvette Z06 Carbon Aero Packages Currently Under Constraint

The <u>2024 Corvette</u> Z06 drops in as the second model-year for the go-faster <u>C8 Z06</u>, once again delivering impressive track-ready performance and a high-revving, flat-plane-crank V8 engine. All of this goodness is wrapped in an aggressive exterior, which can be enhanced even further with the addition of the optional carbon fiber aero packages. Unfortunately, *GM Authority* has learned that the 2024 Corvette Z06 carbon aero packages are currently under constraint.

The two 2024 Corvette Z06 aero package in question include the following (relevant RPO codes listed in parentheses): Carbon Flash-painted carbon fiber package with high wing, dive planes and ground effects (T0F) Visible carbon fiber package with high wing, dive planes and ground effects (T0G)

The TOF carbon fiber aero package normally costs \$8,495, while the TOG carbon fiber aero package normally costs \$10,495. Currently, the TOF package is constrained at 30 percent, while the TOG package is constrained at 20 percent. Essentially, this means that the available supply for these packages is limited at 30 percent and 20 percent, respectively, of what GM originally expected to receive and sell.

This constraint also impacts the availability of the Z07 Performance Package, which requires either the T0F package or the T0G package. It's unclear at this time when these constraints will be lifted.

As a reminder, the 2024 Corvette Z06 is equipped as standard with the naturally aspirated 5.5L V8 LT6 gasoline engine, which is rated at 670 horsepower and 460 pound-feet of torque. The LT6 has a redline set at 8,600 rpm, and emits an exotic-sounding exhaust note courtesy of its flat-plane crankshaft. Output is sent rearwards through the eight-speed dual-clutch automatic transmission, sending the sports car from 0 to 60 mph in just 2.6 seconds.

The GM Y2 platform provides the underpinnings, while production takes place exclusively at the <u>GM Bowling Green plant</u> in Kentucky.



Celebrity Corvette Owners

Dinah Shore

American Actress, Variety Show Host, and Singer, Dinah Shore showing off her 1953 Corvette. She was a spokesperson and sang the song, <u>"See the U.S.A. in Your Chevrolet"</u>.



Dinah Shore (born **Frances Rose Shore**; February 29, 1916 – February 24, 1994) was an American singer, actress, and television personality, and the chart-topping female vocalist of the 1940s. She rose to prominence as a recording artist during the <u>Big Band</u> era. She achieved even greater success a decade later in television, mainly as the host of a series of variety programs for the **Chevrolet** automobile company.

After failing singing auditions for the bands of <u>Benny Goodman</u>, and both <u>Jimmy</u> and <u>Tommy Dorsey</u>, Shore struck out on her own. She became the first singer of her era to achieve huge solo success. She had a string of eighty charted popular hits, spanning from 1940 to 1957, and after appearing in a handful of feature films, she went on to a four-decade career in American television. She starred in her own music and <u>variety shows</u> from 1951 through 1963 and hosted two talk shows in the 1970s. <u>TV Guide</u> ranked her at number 16 on their list of the top 50 television stars of all time. Stylistically, Shore was compared to two singers who followed her in the mid-to-late 1940s and early 1950s, <u>Jo Stafford</u> and <u>Patti Page</u>.



The National Corvette Museum Report <u>Rick Poepping, NCM Ambassador</u> October, 2023

Latest News:



The National Corvette Museum delivered Stingray Convertible VIN #001 on Friday, September 29 to Jeff and Missy Garner. Delivered with the R8C option code and full VIP National Corvette Museum delivery experience, the Garner's factory-fresh Artic White Stingray Convertible received a thundering boom of applause as it excited the Museum's Corvette Boulevard, marking not only the historic VIN but also the start of 2024 model year deliveries at the Museum.

The R8C delivery is available through any Chevrolet Dealer, when specified during ordering, R8C customers are welcomed with signs and a guided VIP tour of the Museum where their car is displayed on Corvette Boulevard, followed by an orientation and presentation of their new vehicle. Customers also receive a one-year individual membership to the National Corvette Museum, a unique gold decal on the inside of the driver's door jamb, and a commemorative wall plaque with the customer's name, date of delivery, and VIN.

The 7th National Corvette Caravan is slated for August 29-31, 2024.

Often referred to as the world's largest moving automotive event, the National Corvette Caravan is a celebration of America's Sports Car, culminating in Bowling Green, Kentucky for the anniversary celebration of the National Corvette Museum. Hosted only once every five years, the next event is slated for Labor Day Weekend 2024 and will mark the Museum's 30th Anniversary.

Kansas and Missouri – 2024 National Corvette Caravan

Chevrolet's legendary sports car is about to get even fiercer. The 670-horsepower Corvette Z06 — motivated by a naturally aspirated 5.5-liter V-8 engine—will be upstaged by a new ZR1 in 2025. The ZR1 will strap a pair of turbochargers to the flat-plane-crank, 5.5-liter V-8 engine found in the Z06, where it produces 670 hp. The addition of forced induction should push the ZR1's horsepower output to over 800 ponies. All of that oomph will be sent to the rear wheels, where wide, grippy tires should help the power translate to blisteringly quick lap times. The ZR1 should also retain the beefy carbon-fiber brakes from the Z06, and we predict that it will rip to 60 mph in under 2.5 seconds. There have been reports lately of some camouflaged sightings.

We need to start thinking about our designs for next year's banner. I would like to have designs shared by the November meeting. We would then vote at the January meeting for our 2024 banner design.



If you are in need of a new Corvette or vehicle of any type go and see The OCC's good friend and Club Sponsor at Jim Butler Chevrolet in Fenton in the Gravois Bluffs Complex!

First big-block Corvette: Chevy also gave us the first big-block Corvette in 1965. The L78 396-cubic-inch V-8 had an iron block and heads, an aluminum intake manifold, solid lifters, and big Holley carburetor. It cost \$292.70 and was installed in 2157 Corvettes. With 425 hp it was the most powerful engine offered up until that time.

The L78 396 made its first appearance during the middle of the **1965** model year in the Chevrolet Corvette and full-size Chevrolet models. Its output was factory rated at 425 gross horsepower and 415 lb-ft of gross torque in 1965. The L78 396 after 1965 would never again be available in the Corvette or any full-size Chevy model.
