



Yenko Pedal Car Donated To National Corvette Museum

This adorable little Corvette pedal car measures in at 53 inches long and 24 inches wide. Its body is made of a single piece of molded plastic, and even features a two-speed transmission with nylon beveled gears controlled by a low- and high-speed shift handle mounted on the steering column. A heavy duty welded steel frame holds the toy Corvette together, and Yenko adorned it with Chevrolet and Gulf Oil decals.

The Corvette pedal car's patina shows evidence of years of wear, tear and play. The National Corvette Museum states that Lynn lost track of the pedal car for a few years, but as it turns out, Yenko had simply handed it off to one of their neighbors. It didn't resurface until 2002, when the vehicle's current owner donated the custom pedal car to the National Corvette Museum, where it is kept on display to this day.



While Don Yenko is famous for modifying and racing Chevrolet muscle cars such as the Camaro, Nova and Vega, he also built a Corvette for his daughter, Lynn. This Corvette, however, is a scaled-down replica of the sports car's 1956 model year, built so young Lynn could pedal around in style. It was recently donated to the National Corvette Museum for display.

Lynn paid a visit to her childhood pedal car at the museum's campus in Bowling Green, Kentucky, and she became a little bit misty-eyed when she saw the small Corvette toy that provided so much joy for her as a young girl. Currently, the vehicle is maintained in its condition as is, scuffs and all, to represent a well-worn and well-loved piece of Don Yenko's legacy.

Interestingly, this isn't the first Corvette pedal car to surface recently – a toy based on the 1953 Chevy Corvette popped up for sale just last week.

- Corvette Plant to Resume Plant Tours!

Tours will go on sale to the public via the National Corvette Museum's website on Tuesday, November 1, 2022. National Corvette Museum members qualify for early booking access, beginning on Tuesday, October 25, 2022. Tour scheduling will take place at the time of purchase with public tours expected to resume before the end of the year.

In 1981, General Motors moved production of the Chevrolet Corvette from St. Louis, MO to 600 Corvette Drive, Bowling Green, KY. Known as "America's Sports Car," the plant tour allows visitors to watch an icon in the making. The Corvette is the world's longest-running, continuously produced passenger car with more than 1.75 million produced. The GM site consists of 212 acres, and the plant has 1.7 million square feet –equivalent to 39 acres or 29.5 football fields, under roof.

Plant tours were initially suspended in 2017 due to plant enhancements and significant layout changes of the facility. The Covid pandemic further delayed plant tours. "We have been waiting for this day for what feels like an eternity," said Kai Spande, Plant Director for the General Motors Bowling Green Assembly Plant and Board Chairman of the National Corvette Museum.

She had her own claim to fame as a professional model in Berlin and as a dancer with the Follies Bergère in Paris, the Copacabana in Miami and on Broadway in New York. She even learned to fly an airplane long before Zora did.

As a factory effort, the Pratt & Miller led Corvette Racing team would open marketing doors; create excitement for race fans world-wide; provide a valuable technology transfer link between the race group and production group; while taking over 120 victories worldwide (one of those being the overall win at the 24 Hours of Daytona), 14 Manufacturers Championships, and 8 class wins at Le Mans.

Told by a friend that he would never be a chief designer or executive at GM because he was an African American, Ed began to push harder. His creativity, work ethic, and natural leadership skills would ultimately take him to the position of Global Vice President of Design.

OLD CAR COLUMN

1956 Studebaker Commander Parkview wagon

is a true survivor

It's not likely you'll ever see a car like this again in your lifetime unless you go to a local car show where this Study's owner, Duane Koerber, is showing it off. I met Duane and saw his car on Saturday, June 25, at the 20th Annual Pacific Car Show and Block Party, one of the premier car events in the metro area. This year's show brought roughly 500 plus cars and hundreds of spectators who just came to droot.

When they were first made, the Studebaker 1956 model year sold a total of 69,593 of which 3,333 were Commander Parkviews. The Commander Parkview was the mid-level model of the station wagon line until 1957. Entry level was the Champion Pelham and top-of-the-line was the President Pinehurst. All were two-door models. Duane's Commander Parkview had a base factory suggested price of \$2,354 before options, taxes, delivery and dealer prep. That equals \$25,296 in today's dollars.

Duane, a retired carpenter supervisor, purchased the car about two years ago after a friend told him about finding the car stored in a garage in Pevely, Mo.

Duane's Studebaker is decked out in a two-tone color scheme of Snowcap White over Yellowstone, and it is believed to be the original paint. The wagon is powered by the Studebaker, 259 cubic-inch overhead valve V-8, topped by a four-barrel Carter carburetor. Duane admits that after purchasing the car, he had some work done to the engine and it now puts out more than the original 170 brake horsepower. Options on this wagon include power steering, an AM radio and overdrive.

Studebaker is an orphan marque, a once-fine American automobile that went by the wayside in March 1966. But they

still hold strong appeal to some. While interviewing Duane at the show in Pacific, I met Ben Allspach who owns a 1949 Studebaker Champion business coupe. He is a member of the Gateway Chapter of the Studebaker Drivers Club, an active club for Studebaker owners as well as those who are just interested in the brand. 
