I can't thank you all enough for helping out in such a big way, and working in the various areas needed throughout the day. I SENT AN EMAIL TO The Gateway Camaro Club for all their help this year. They stepped it up from last year in a big way. We had a perfect day for the show.

Once again, we had a big task ahead of us to bring about a show, better than last year. We did have one little hiccup, and that was the fact that even though the show started at 9:00, people were starting to line up at 7:30. This did not allow us to get set up in any reasonable fashion, so there was about 45 minutes of pure chaos. Once the mad rush subsided, things flowed really well. The crew working at registration did a fantastic job getting through the early part of registration and after the show, we had discussions as to how to go about solving the obvious issue with people showing up 1-1/2 hours early to register for a show that actually doesn't start until Noon. Other than that early fiasco, the rest of the day went rather smoothly.

50/50 ticket sales started just after 9:00 and the prize raffle was open shortly after that. Members from both Clubs provided 58 baskets for the raffle. The judges were out at noon to start their judging and were finished judging by about 1:30. That was a lot of judging in 1-1/2 hours. While they tallied their results, the prize raffle started and went exceptionally fast. After that was the 50/50 drawing.

As a result of everyone's efforts the final tally for the show is:

123 cars were judged 68 cars were display only for a total of 191 cars. However, there were a few that snuck in without any registration after 12:00 so there were over 200 cars at the show. Participants came from as far as Lake of the Ozarks, Columbia, Jeff City, Wentzville, Alton, Fairview Heights and Belleville.

Registration totaled\$3,870.0Prize Raffel raised\$1,005.0050/50 raised\$1,207.00 with the winner taking home \$604.00Total Money raised for "The Boys and Girls Club of Greater St. Louis" was \$5,478.00 beating last years total. And justfor the record, The Annual Butler Show has raised \$13,655.00 over the last 3 years.

Once again, thank you all that worked the shows and to those members that came out for the show. I apologize that I may have missed seeing you at the show.
