# The President's Report July 2024 Kenneth Schaeffler, President Original Corvette Club of St. Louis



Thank you all for coming out tonight.

- Welcome back to Saucy's. Thank you to all members that participated in the "Show & Shine" last month. We had 30 beautiful Corvettes in the parking lots and Mike Koenen was he Saucy's Gift Card winner.
- This month we celebrated Independence Day. 248 years!
- Thank to those members for participating in America's Birthday Parade. It was a rainy, ugly start to the day, but it cleared up nicely and the parade took place without any problems. The club was represented with 5 cars due to weather, and there appeared to be a number of other participants that didn't show. Jim Butler Chevrolet provided a 2025 Silverado to carry the banner this year. Ironically, it was all electric!
- I'm hoping the winners of the Cardinals tickets last meeting brought home winners.
- The Pacific Car Show was a huge success again this year and a big "Thank You" to all the members that helped out with registration and judging. Larry will talk about it a little later
- The name tags that were ordered at the last meeting have come in and I have them up here at the front table.
- I received notice that the shirts have been delivered. They were a little late in getting in due to the holiday, but now they are being embroidered. They hope to have the embroidery completed this week and ready to ship. I am also working on some other stuff to be made available through the OCC Store.
- I made a whirlwind road trip to California a couple weeks ago. The total trip was 4,400 miles and I averaged 28.3 mpg. It's obvious the only thing I stopped for was to stretch my legs or get gas. I also had a 250 mile stretch that my 50 mile averages were over 40mpg with my best topping out at 45.3 mpg.
- The next major was getting the new "CLUBWORKS" Site, the Groupworks replacement. It has been a ton of work, but I have everyone registered so you have access. A little later, I will go through the steps to show everyone how to access the site. At this time, the "EVENTS CALENDAR" is working for members to see all of our events and the calendar can also be seen by the public for events like the monthly meeting or the "Annual Jim Butler Show". The events posted can be determined at the time of adding them to the calendar as "Members Only" or "Public". They also list them in different categories like "Social Event", Fundraiser", "General Meeting" or "Annual Event". And they're color coded on the calendar. At this time, only admin can add events, so you will need to contact me if you would like tohave an event posted. Like "Winery runs", "Lunches" or similar events for members only. Events that are not sponsored by OCC, but those that we attend can also be posted to help other groups increse participation. I continue working on the website and "Clubworks" to add more things, and the next big push other than members ability to post events will be the "Forum" where members can post photos and have comments similar to the "POSTS" tab in the old Groupworks. I as mentioned last month in talking about the new format, it is extremely powerful and has many capabilities that will be useful to the Club and our social presence. I have also learned that the website can generate and email invoices automatically for membership renewals. It also has the capabilities to accept online payments, but that is something that I will be looking at closely, as there is usually a charge from card companies with credit or debit payments.
- I will also be sending a copy of the current "Member Directory" to everyone via email. You can save it to your computer or upload to your phone file for easy viewing. This may be necessary for a while until I can get the member list able to be viewed by the members on the "Clubworks" site. Please be assured that you member information will Not be public. It will be for "members only"

#### • New Sinkhole exhibit includes Sinkhole Corvette ignition keys

The news coming out of Bowling Green, Kentucky on February 12, 2014, was unbelievable. A sinkhole had opened in the National Corvette Museum's Skydome during the early morning hours, swallowing eight cars. The Corvettes plunged 30 feet into a previously undiscovered cave. In the following weeks and months, visitors would flock to the Museum to see the sinkhole for themselves. Meanwhile, staff pondered how to recover the damaged Corvettes and repair the gaping hole in the floor of the Skydome.

#### • 2024 National Corvette Caravan



This window sticker is amazing showing the 425 hp big block only costing a mere \$292.70 as an option, just a little more than the am/fm radio!
