



## SWIMMING GUIDELINES

1. Participants must arrive wearing their swimsuits, underneath their clothing, on Friday, June 26, 2026.
2. Participants are required to bring a towel and appropriate cover-up clothing or an additional change of clothes to be worn over swimwear when traveling to and from the aquatic facility.
3. Participants may bring goggles if desired.
4. Participants are encouraged to bring swim shoes, water shoes, or sandals to provide foot protection while in and around the pool area.
5. Toys, floaties, dive toys, inflatables, water squirters, blaster, water-activated robotic toys, beach balls, foam oodles, kickboards, etc. ARE ALL PROHIBITED.
6. Participants must wear closed-toe footwear at all times while attending camp, including during travel to and from the aquatics facility at *de Toledo High School*. Footwear shall remain on until participants have entered the designated pool area and must be worn again immediately upon departure from the facility for the return to camp.
7. Participants should be appropriately attired at all times while traveling to and from the aquatic facility, including when walking in public areas and crossing roadways. Appropriate attire should be worn in accordance with camp policies and applicable safety considerations.
8. Prior to entering the water or participating in any swimming or aquatic activity, each participant shall be required to attempt the BSA Swim Test, as administered or supervised by authorized camp aquatics personnel. Failure or refusal to attempt the BSA Swim Test may forfeit the privilege of participation in the swimming and aquatic activities, as determined by the Aquatics Director.
9. If a participant's behavior has violated any of the BSA rules guidelines, protocols and procedures, as well as the Rules and Guidelines set forth by the Aquatics Director and de Toledo High school, the scout will be asked to go home and must be promptly picked up by a parent, legal guardian or authorized adult.
10. In the event of any emergency, parents and/or legal guardians acknowledge and agree that the Health Officer, Camp Director, Aquatics Director, and/or other authorized camp personnel may take such actions as they reasonably deem necessary to preserve life, prevent further injury, and protect the health and safety of the participant, including the provision of emergency first aid, life-saving measures, and the procurement of emergency medical treatment and transportation when circumstances warrant. Parents and/or legal guardians further authorize camp personnel to seek and obtain emergency medical care on behalf of the participant when a parent or legal guardian cannot be reached in a timely manner.
