Tucson Gem Shows -Presentation by Dewey Buck

If you want to beat the cold snowy winters of Ohio and see collections of rocks, minerals, gems & fossils from around the world, then Tucson, Arizona is the place to go! Dewey Buck, Mike Manning and a few other members of our club have traveled west to experience such adventures over the past few winters. In fact, most of our spring show's raffle prizes have returned to Ohio from the Tucson Gem Shows.

How did this amazing venue get started? The year was 1955 and Bob Root, a mineral dealer from Denver, convinced Dan Caudle, Harold Rupert, and Clayton Gibson of the Tucson Gem and Mineral Society to try hosting a rock show. The first show was held in a school, admission was free and 1,500 people were in attendance. This was a judged competition of exhibits. Some of the categories included cabinet specimens, miniature specimens, "thumbnail" specimens and cabochons. In addition, "fossil folks" were thrilled with the category labeled "paleontological oddities." The first year was quite a success and the Tucson Gem and Mineral Society began planning for next year's displays.

The years to follow saw continued growth in attendance, vendors and exhibits. It wasn't until the early 1960's however that show chairman, Clayton Chapman, had an inspiration. He invited Mr. Paul Desautels, the assistant curator of the Smithsonian Institution's mineral collection, to come to the show and to bring with him a noteworthy exhibit from the shelves of the Smithsonian. The invitation was accepted and this began an amazing relationship between Tucson and the Smithsonian for years to come. It also opened the doors to others through out the U.S.A. and the world to see and hear about amazing collections and specimens.

Wulfenite, 19,227-carat ruby corundum crystal, calcite crystals, uncut emeralds, formacite, linarite, caledonite, diaboleite, cerussite with azurite & aurichalcite and a skull of an unidentified pre-historic animal were some of the curiosities that attracted visitors during the 1960's. The show was housed at the fairgrounds until the early 1970's and today the main show is held at the Tucson Convention Center. But, unlike the early years when the show was only a 2 day event in March, a rock enthusiast could literally spend January-March exploring Arizona and other parts of the west!

Everyone in attendance this evening agreed that a field trip to see the wonders of the world in Tucson would be amazing! Thanks for sharing some of the treasures that you purchased Dewey - the boxes of fluorescent stones under black lights were awesome! Make sure you pick Dewey's brain for all of the do's & don'ts if you plan a trip to Arizona!
