## Parents are Important



Parents are an important part of the Title I program. Parental permission is required for both testing and entry into the program. Parents are informed of their children's progress and are encouraged to participate in the learning process.

## In support of parent involvement:

- Parents/guardians are invited to attend an Open House in the fall to meet the Title I teachers and learn more about the program.
- Parents/guardians are encouraged to have input into the instructional goals for their children.
- Parents/guardians, teachers, and students signify their commitment to the Title I program by signing a written school-parent compact.
- ❖ Appointments can be made to meet with Title I teachers and classroom teachers to review progress and cooperatively plan for continued support.
- Parents/guardians are provided with information and materials throughout the year that may benefit their children's progress at home.
- Title I teachers keep records of testing and signed permission forms.

- Read with your child for at least 15 minutes every day
- Set up a home library
- Give books as gifts
- Make newspapers and magazines available
- Read signs, labels, and directions aloud
- Be a reading model for your child
