Parents are an important part of the Title I program. Parental permission is required for both testing and entry into the program. Parents are informed of their children's progress and are encouraged to participate in the learning process.

In support of parent involvement:

- ❖ Parents/guardians are invited to attend an Open House in the fall to meet the Title I teachers and learn more about the program.
- ❖ Parents/guardians are encouraged to have input into the instructional goals for their children.
- ❖ Parents/guardians, teachers, and students signify their commitment to the Title I program by signing a written school-parent compact.
- ❖ Appointments can be made to meet with Title I teachers and classroom teachers to review progress and cooperatively plan for continued support.
- ❖ Parents/guardians are provided with information and materials throughout the year that may benefit their children's progress at home.
- ❖ Title I teachers keep records of testing and signed permission forms.



HOW YOU CAN ENCOURAGE YOUR CHILD TO READ:

- ❖ Make newspapers and magazines available
