Program Overview

The Master of Arts in Criminal Justice (MACJ) program at Sacred Heart University (SHU) will provide you with comprehensive knowledge of the criminal justice system. Whether you are a mid-career professional or an entry-level graduate student, the MACJ program at Sacred Heart University has something to offer. The MACJ degree is designed to be rigorous and challenge you academically, while also being flexible, allowing you to tailor your course of study to your particular interests. The program is open to candidates with undergraduate degrees in any field of study.

Thirty-three (33) credits are required to graduate from the program. Courses are offered during the evenings and online. The program may be completed on a full-time or part-time basis. Students must complete 15 required credits of the core curriculum plus an additional 18 credits of elective courses. The program awards life-experience credits to eligible students. Up to six credits can be earned by students who demonstrate substantial criminal justice experience that is relevant to the educational program.

As part of the 18 credits of electives, students may choose a 12-credit concentration in:

- * Criminal Justice Management
- * National Security
- * Victimology

Upon completion of the required 33 credits, students must successfully pass a comprehensive examination, which bears no credit towards the 33-credit requirement for graduation, or pursue a six-credit thesis option. The thesis is used to satisfy six of the 18 elective credits.



OUR GRADUATES

The MACJ degree provides individuals with the knowledge required to obtain advanced professional positions in the field and it enables individuals already employed in the field of criminal justice to further advance their careers.

Alumni currently hold positions as federal law enforcement agents, corrections officers, higher education emergency management consultants, probation officers, private investigators and police officers.

This program is appropriate for individuals interested in pursuing an academic career in higher education or those interested in pursuing a Ph.D. in criminal justice.
