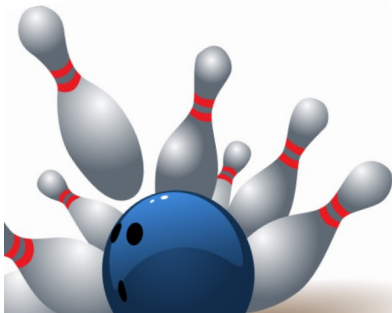

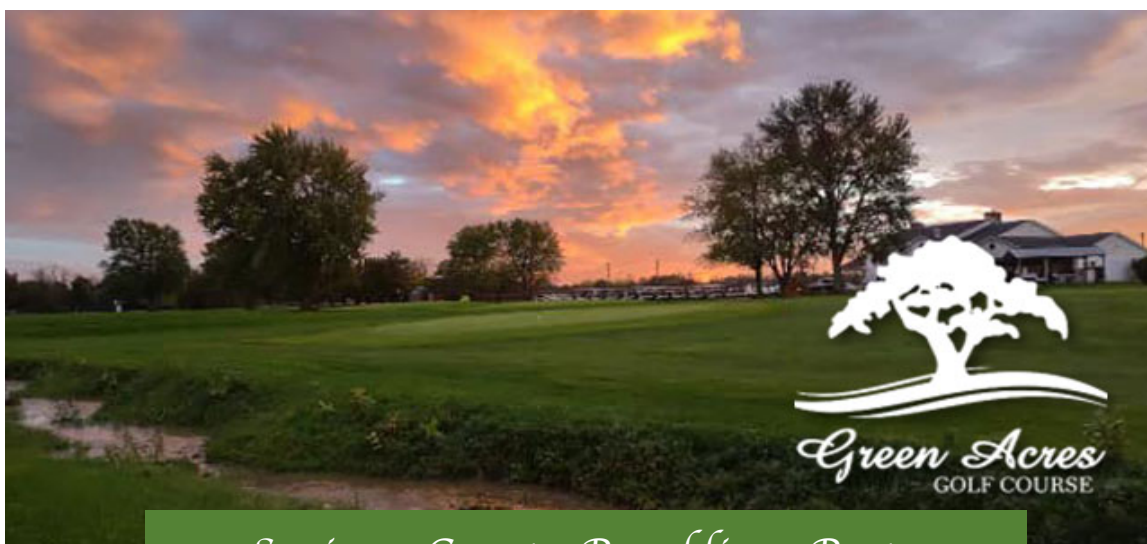

INITIATIVE PETITION AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION

Constitutional amendment to guarantee voters in Michigan the right to: rank candidates in order of preference in most federal, state, and certain local elections; require that candidates for major offices receive a majority of votes to be elected; receive timely notice of changes to polling places or voting procedures; cast a ballot if in line at the time the polls close; use secure and accessible paper ballots, preserved for certification, recounts, and audits; vote for eligible write-in candidates not listed on the ballot; participate in primary elections held at least 140 days before the general election.

For the full text of proposed Article 2, §§ 4A, 5, and 11, see the reverse side of this petition. Provisions of existing constitution altered or abrogated by the proposal if adopted: Art. 2, § 5.

We, the undersigned qualified and registered electors, residents in the county of _____, State of Michigan, respectfully petition for amendment to constitution.

The undersigned circulator of the above petition asserts that he or she is 18 years of age or older and a United States citizen; that each signature on the petition was signed in his or her presence; that he or she has neither caused nor permitted a person to sign the petition more than once and has no knowledge of a person signing the petition more than once; and that, to his or her best knowledge and belief, each signature is the genuine signature of the person purporting to sign the petition, the person signing the petition was at the time of signing a registered elector of the city or township indicated preceding the signature, and the elector was qualified to sign the petition.

SAGINAW TOWNSHIP \$169.2 MILLION BOND PROPOSED FOR SCHOOLS



The Saginaw Township Board of Education has approved an application to the Michigan Treasury for a \$169.2 million bond proposal to fund school building improvements, renovations, and modifications across the district. This money would be used for capital improvements only and not the day-to-day operation of schools.

This appears to be a \$2.85 mill tax increase, which, if approved, would cost a Saginaw Township homeowner about \$11.88 per month for each \$100,000 of assessed property value.

The proposal is expected to be put before voters on the Nov. 4th ballot if the Michigan Treasury approves it.



Currently Saginaw Township Homeowners are taxed for the following in Winter: Senior Citizens, Mosquito Control, County Parks, Castle Museum, Event Center, Animal Control Sheriff Service, Children's Zoo, 9-1-1 Authority, Hospital Debt, Health Dept, and Roads. On the Summer Property Tax bill are Township Allocated Millage, Voter-Approved Police Millage, Fire Protection, Universal Pump Station, Street Lighting, and Refuse.

This new millage can only be assessed if the citizens of Saginaw Township vote to pay for this tax increase.

In 2023, citizens formed a committee to Vote No, fighting against a \$250 million. That campaign was successful.

COMBATING MISINFORMATION:

Tools Every Conservative Should Know

In today's media landscape, where headlines move faster than facts and social media spreads rumors like wildfire, it's more important than ever for conservatives to be well-informed, critical thinkers. Misinformation isn't just an annoyance—it's a strategic tool often used to confuse voters, divide communities, and weaken our constitutional values. But we're not powerless. With the right tools and habits, every Republican can be a champion of truth.

Why Misinformation Matters

Fake news isn't always obvious. Sometimes it comes in the form of twisted facts, cherry-picked statistics, or out-of-context video clips. Unfortunately, these falsehoods are often used to discredit conservative leaders, distort legislation, or stir up outrage before the facts are known. As Republicans, we believe in personal responsibility—and that includes the responsibility to verify information before spreading it. Doing so strengthens our credibility and equips us to push back against biased narratives.

Five Tools Every Conservative Should Know

1. Fact-Checking Sites (Use Carefully):
 - RealClearPolitics, JustTheNews, and The Federalist offer grounded conservative analysis.
 - Use non-partisan sites like Ballotpedia or GovTrack to verify legislation and voting records.
 - Beware of "fact-checkers" with known bias—always read critically.
2. Official Sources Over Social Media
 - Don't rely on Facebook or Twitter posts for news—go straight to official press releases, candidate websites, or the legislature's own site.
 - For Michigan, visit: www.legislature.mi.gov to track bills and votes directly.
3. Think Tanks and Policy Centers
 - Groups like The Heritage Foundation, Mackinac Center for Public Policy, and Hillsdale College's Kirby Center provide in-depth conservative perspectives grounded in facts and scholarship.
4. Ask Local Leaders
 - If something seems off, reach out to your local Republican leaders. Misinformation thrives in silence—let's talk to each other first.
 - Don't hesitate to email the Saginaw GOP at saginawgopsecretary@gmail.com with questions or concerns. We will do our best to point you in the right direction for reputable information.
5. Be a Trusted Messenger
 - When you find the truth, share it. Correct bad information kindly but clearly.
 - Encourage others to follow reliable sources, subscribe to the county newsletter, and attend meetings where they can hear facts firsthand.

A Final Word

We can't control the media, but we can control our response to it. Conservatives across the country are waking up to the power of truth and the importance of discernment. When we're equipped with facts, we can defend our values, challenge falsehoods, and inspire confidence in our movement.

Let's be the voice of reason in a noisy world—and help others find the truth, too.

WE REMEMBER OUR HISTORY...

In 1869, President Ulysses S. Grant (R) called for construction of a canal across Panama. Such a canal would cut Atlantic-to-Pacific voyage time by 1/3 and eliminate the dangerous journey around South America. He sent 7 survey expeditions to explore the route. An American company tried & failed to cross Nicaragua. Then in 1881, a French company tried, but went bankrupt, due to finances, engineering problems & worker fatalities.

During the Spanish-American War, an American warship steamed around the Cape from California to the Caribbean, re-igniting public enthusiasm & adding a military justification. With the acquisition of island territories in the Caribbean & Pacific in 1898, a canal became vital to U.S. national security. But Congress was split over which route to finance—Nicaragua or Panama? President William McKinley (R) appointed a commission that recommended Nicaragua. But, after McKinley's assassination, President Theodore Roosevelt (R) reinstated the commission to push for Panama.

On May 2, 1902, Mont Pelee on Martinique erupted, killing 30,000. A Nicaraguan volcano (Mt. Momotombo, about 100 miles from the proposed route) erupted days later. Congress voted for the Panama route!



In response to delays by Colombian nationalists (Panama was still part of Colombia), Secretary of State John Hay threatened to build in Nicaragua. Colombia responded, signing a treaty for a 100-year lease on a 6-mile-wide strip of land, in January 1903. When Colombians protested the unfavorable terms, the Senate in Bogotá rejected the treaty. An infuriated Roosevelt told Hay: *"I do not think the Bogotá lot of jackrabbits should be allowed permanently to bar one of the future highways of civilization."*

Determined to break ground before his reelection in November, 1904, Roosevelt landed troops in Panama 6 times to protect the transit zone. Fortunately, Panamanians had a long history of rebellion against Bogotá. In October 1903, the U.S. Navy sent warships to Panama's coast. On November 4th, a small, disorganized Panamanian army secured a nearly bloodless victory—in the shadow of U.S. naval guns—and declared independence. The U.S. quickly extended recognition, and on November 18, a canal treaty was signed with the new Republic of Panama.

Construction of the 51-mile canal began in March 1904. Yellow fever & malaria had stopped the French, but strenuous efforts were made to combat mosquitos—newly discovered to be carriers of both deadly diseases (*probably by Michiganders!*). Even so, 1000s of workers died over the 10 years it took to build the canal. Still, the canal was completed **2 years ahead of its 1916 target date!**



On August 15, 1914, the *U.S.S. Ancon* was the first ship to pass through the completed canal—in 9 hours and 40 minutes! The Panama Canal was vital for expanding American global power, and it produced advances in engineering, technology & medicine. Thank you, President Theodore Roosevelt!

Footnote: In the 1960s, disputes over revenue & control soured relations with Panama. In 1977, Jimmy Carter (D), arguing that the size of modern warships made the canal obsolete, signed a new treaty committing the US to withdrawal, in exchange for permanent neutrality. The treaty was ratified by Congress amidst bitter political debate (Sen. Robert Byrd (D,WV) cast the deciding vote). Panama took full control December, 1999. President Trump has expressed concern over high transit fees & China's presence at both ends of the canal, revealing that Panama is close to breaching its treaty obligations.



An Appeal from MIGOP Chairman Jim Runestad

Dear Fellow Republicans,

State law requires that election inspectors (also known as election workers) be hired in equal numbers from the two major political parties. For the 2024 Presidential Election, Detroit hired 4,500 inspectors. However, **only 12% of them were Republicans**. Why so few? While the law requires party balance, that balance can only be achieved if enough qualified applicants from each party are available.

Despite strong recruitment efforts in 2024, too few Republicans applied, completed training, and showed up to work. **The bottom line: If we want election oversight, we have to show up and provide it.** Those who work as election inspectors in 2025 will be given priority for hiring in the critical 2026 election. **This is a paid position, with daily pay ranging from \$300 to \$600.**
