Dreaming of Sugarplums — *Documentary Film Producer*

"Dreaming of Sugarplums" documents the artistic experiences of students who dance annually with the professional ballet dancers of the Island Moving Company in "The Nutcracker Ballet in Newport's Rosecliff Mansion." Without a stage to draw the line between reality and fantasy, young dancers return like a tribe to perform in this site-specific production throughout a Neo-Rococco Gilded Age mansion, in pursuit of their artistic souls. Responsibilities included securing a \$15,000 grant from the William Froleich Foundation, and a matching grant from a private funder, securing filmmaker, press and social media relations, researching the history of the house and ballet, acting intermediary between/ filmmaker and dance company, organizing interviews with children, parents, dancers, company ED and artistic director, professional dancers, Rosecliff personal and the Newport Preservation Society.
