




Weather Alert!

Prevent water damage from melting snow/ice

As warming weather melts the accumulated snow, and the potential for rain in the forecast increases, there is a higher risk of water entering your home. If you live near a creek, river or lake, you could also be at risk of rising water levels that can change suddenly. Here are some steps you can take to help reduce the potential for water to enter your basement:

- Shovel snow away from windows at ground level, as this could be an easy point of entry
- Keep snow clear of the foundations to prevent seepage into the basement
- Direct downspouts away from the buildings, so that melting snow off the roof or rain, doesn't pool around the building. Consider adding a downspout extension if necessary
- Keep the area around downspouts clear so that the water can drain away from the home
- Use a roof rake to clear snow away from the eaves so that melting snow and ice or rain can follow the eaves to downspouts. This will also help reduce the creation of ice backups
- Move valuables from the basement or lower levels to upper floors if possible
