1. Website Overview

KawarthaVillage.ca is designed to provide members with important information about the cooperative, upcoming events, policies, and community updates. The site features:

- Home Page: General information about the cooperative living, Community Centre Booking process, office hours, Friday Notes and additional announcements that are planned for the future.
- CABCC Bookings: Details about the community centre and the booking form.
- News & Updates: Recent announcements and community news.
- KVC Bylaws & Policy: This includes the Occupancy and Organizational Bylaws and KVC Policies
- Activity Calendar: Information about meetings regarding committee meetings, etc.
- Applications: Membership Application Form and Community Centre Form
- Private Members Section: A secure area with confidential cooperative information such as board minutes.

2. How to Access the Private Members Section

Step 1: Navigate to the Login Page

- Visit KawarthaVillage.ca.
- Click on the "Members Login" link located in the main menu.

Step 2: Enter Your Credentials

- You will be prompted to enter your username and password.
- If you do not have login credentials, click on "Request Access" and follow the instructions.

Step 3: Navigating the Members Area

- Once logged in, you will have access to:

- Your Board of Directors
- <u>Board Minutes</u>: The Board Minutes will be posted here once they have been approved at the next board meeting.

- <u>Complaint Form</u>
- Friday Notes
- KVC Market Place

Step 4: Logging Out

• For security purposes, always log out when finished by clicking the "Logout" button in the top-right corner of the page.
