PURPOSE OF THE MEETING:

- MCWI Round Two Submission with Cook Coggin Engineers, Inc. –Nick Brawner with Cook Coggin Engineer, Inc.- present:
 - Reviewed over the specifics of the application:
 - The resubmission includes the scope of the work, the budget, and map
 - Three points of interests: gravity line between Meadowbrook and Poplar, finish the riprap at the lagoon, and sewer line at Grant Place
 - \$275,000.00 is a two to one match
 - Four percent for professional services will not be included in the match.
 - Investment is estimated at \$249,000.00 for \$600,000.00 worth of work
 - Figures:
 - ARPA Match: \$175,000.00 (local portion)
 - Grant: \$351,240.00
 - Non eligible: \$72,975.00
 - Total: \$599,835.00
 - Leaves \$26,405.00 for Public Works Director Jim Curry to use to purchase VFDs for the wells.
- Letter for Procurement for Engineering Professional Services Selection ARPA MCWI Grant Program:
 - Nick Brawner explained that the Town need to draft a letter stating, "The Town of Plantersville is requesting to use the Small Purchase Procedures as outlined in the Mississippi Department of Transportation's (MDOT) Local Public Agency Consultant Operating Procedures for Professional Services, Section 2.2.1 Small Purchase Procedures."
 - This letter is to document that the Town has considered three of the most qualified
 engineering firms to assist with the MCWI and that the Town has selected an
 engineering company from the three considered in order to be in compliance with

MDOT Local Public Agency Consultant Operating Procedures for Professional Services, Section 2.2.1 Small Purchase Procedures.

- Renee Morris made the motion to be in compliance with MDOT's Local Public Agency Consultant Operating Procedures for Professional Services, Section 2.2.1 Small Purchase Procedures, the Town has selected Cook Coggin Engineering, Inc. as (the most qualified engineering firm) our Professional Services Consultant to assist the Town with ARPA MCWI Project.
- Sextus Shannon seconded the motion. All were in favor.

• CDBG Sewer Project Update

- Three Rivers have sent off for a current extension for the project.
- June 2023 will be the contract date for the grant
- Enscor, Inc. contractors are waiting for the cable and then cleanup for the project to finally be complete.
- Close out will be around April or May 2023

• Resurfacing Reed Drive:

 Mayor Shelton Shannon talked to Lee County Supervisor Billy Joe Holland about resurfacing Reed Drive and was told that funds weren't available at this time but will review funding efforts later.
