Adopt the Agenda:

Charles Heard made the motion to add the Oak Hall Cap and Gown Company to the agenda and adopt the agenda with the amendments.

Sextus Shannon seconded the motion. All were in favor.

Approve January 2, 2024 minutes:

Charles Heard made the motion to adopt the January 2, 2024 minutes.

Renee Morris seconded the motion. All were in favor.

Public Hearing: Special Exception

- James Birmingham-Modular home at 148 Country Village, present: the modular home will be built beside the mobile home on the property; 18 x 52; will have electricity and plumbing; for family use; it is zoned residential; similar to a shed house built on site; 1 bath and a half with a living room; Code Enforcement Officer Shane Davis have no reservations about the modular home because it can be seen as a guest house; can have a septic tank but need a water meter; Public Works Director Jim Curry and Renee Morris suggested 2 separate water meters but must dig up the drive way; per the ordinance meter approval is at the Board's discretion (share or separate); wood siding with tin roof.
 - Nathan Chisolm made the motion to approve the special exception at 148 Country Village and approved for an additional separate water meter for the modular home.
 - Sextus Shannon seconded the motion. All were in favor.

Public Comments:

• Charles Heard- MML Mid-Winter Legislative Conference Report, present: thanked the Board for allowing him to attend; visited the state capitol with the Mississippi Municipal League and observed the legislature passing bills that can help municipalities; topics of discussions: solidarity- whenever a situation is made public both the mayor and board need to be on one accord when addressing the public even if they disagree within house, need to be more vocal and discuss the situation with both parties involved;

beautification of our Town- find volunteers for a special committee, this will make our town more attractive for new businesses to come into Town; need a close 24 hour medical clinic

- Latisha Robinson, Shannon High School PTO President- Roadblock for Shannon High School PTO and teachers to provide funding for school year events- *present:* help sponsor events in May for teachers and students; proposed date, Saturday, March 23, 2024 from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.; students and teachers will participate and follow safety protocols.
 - Sextus Shannon made the motion to approve the road block for the Shannon High School Booster Club Saturday, March 23, 2024 from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.
 - Charles Heard seconded the motion. All were in favor.
- Oak Hall Cap and Gown Company- representatives, *present:* Mandy Koviol, Director of Manufacturing, present: informing the Town of who they are and they produce graduation cap and gowns; have five manufacturing facilities; Plantersville site have over 100 employees; thanked the Board for allowing them to introduce themselves and allowing them to have their company in Town.
- Bobby Parker- Grant-Wuichet Park Commissioner Candidate, present: retired but is a certified electrician; Renee Morris said Bobby Parker would be a huge benefit for the park and that he is aware it is a non-paid Town position; Nathan Chisolm asked about creating a baseball schedule, Bobby Parker said he will work out a system and have teams to submit a schedule and go from there; Bobby Parker said he doesn't have park and recreation experience but have worked with people from Tupelo Park and Recreation that can assist him; Bobby Parker said the park needs security and correct the culvert issue with the railroad; Mayor Shelton Shannon said Bobby Parker will submit an application to Three Rivers Workers' Program and if approved, he is hired as the park's new park commissioner.
 - Nathan Chisolm made the motion to hire Bobby Parker as Grant-Wuichet Park Commissioner, non-paid Town position, pending Three Rivers Workers' Program approval.
 - Sextus Shannon seconded the motion. All were in favor.
- Oaks of Plantersville- Code Enforcer Shane Davis explained to the audience that the
 project has been approved and the preliminary protocols will begin; Quick summaryconstruction engineers will design a plat checklist; must present the checklist to the
 Board for approval; layout water and sewer areas; file the final plat with the county;
 street designs and public dedication; final step Board will approve building permits and
 the construction of the houses will begin; 44 single family home units; Shane Davis was
 able to answer public concerns during the meeting.

 - Nathan Chisolm, Sextus Shannon, and Charles Heard voted in favor of the motion.
 - Renee Morris opposed the motion. Motion carried with majority vote.

Fire: Fire Chief Jim Curry, present-

• Tombigbee Fiber for First Responders- attended meeting along with Mayor Shelton Shannon and Police Chief Keith Foster: offer free Wi-Fi/fiber for Lee County first responders, "SmartTown", network when service is out at the scene the "SmartTown" network service will allow phones to have the ability to connect to the fiber wireless services.

Nathan Chisolm made the motion to accept both the water and fire reports. Charles Heard seconded the motion. All were in favor.

Police: Police Chief Keith Foster, present-

- Fifty-seven citations were issued; \$4,362.87 collected in court revenues
- Advised the audience to keep doors and windows locked and suggest purchasing a ring camera home security system.
