Cornerstone Faith of West Liberty 1 Thessalonians 1:1-4 – Greetings

I. The Church in...

- The church is not primarily an organization but a living organism located in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ
 - You cannot have a church that self-exists outside of God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ (Matt. 16:18)

A. ...God the Father (a few attributes)

- So pure He cannot look at sin (Hab. 1:3)
- The one Jesus turns everything over to (1 Cor. 15:23-24)
- Lord God Almighty—The Jehovah Names of God (Ex. 6:2-3)
- Creator of All (Gen. 1:1)
- God the Father describes the one to whom we are to pray (Matt. 6:9-13)
- He is one of a few we are to worship (John 4:23-24)

B. ... The Lord Jesus Christ

- Scepter of righteousness is the scepter of His throne (Heb. 1:8-9)
- Attributes of Lord Jesus Christ from John's encounter in Revelation (1:11-18)
- He is coming King—co-regent with God the Father (Rev. 19:11-16; Heb. 10:12)
 - O To change a command of Scripture you must be greater than God who wrote the Scripture—we are not! (Deut. 4:2; Rev. 22:18-19)
 - O This is why Jesus calls those His friends who obey Him (John 15:14)
 - O This is why Jesus says that those who obey Him love Him (John 14:15)
 - O This is why Jesus says those who obey Him the Father and He will manifest themselves in them (John 14:21)

II. Grace and peace from...

- Grace and peace are from God the Father and Jesus Christ to the church that is in them **Philippians 1:2 (NKJV)** *Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.*

A. Grace (Luke 1:30, 2:51-52; John 1:16-17; Rom. 5:1-2; Tit. 2:11-14)

- Grace is God's unmerited divine influence upon our lives making us more like Him.
 - O We cannot earn it, we do not deserve it, we cannot demand it—It is freely given by God to us **John 1:16-17 (NKJV)** And of His fullness we have all received, and <u>grace</u> for <u>grace</u>. ¹⁷ For the law was given through Moses, but <u>grace</u> and truth came through Jesus Christ.

B. Peace (Luke 10:5-6; Rom. 14:17, 15:13, 16:20; Phil. 4:6-7; Matt. 6:25-34)

Peace—The OT equivalent word *shalom* meant wholeness, soundness, hence health, well-being, prosperity; more particularly, peace as opposed to war. cwsd.

Philippians 4:6-7 (NKJV) Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; ⁷ and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

III. We give thanks and pray for you

A. Remembering without ceasing

- 1. Your work of faith
- Faith is not passive—it requires action based on what one has been shown by God (Heb. 11)
- Even the armor of God, such as the shield of faith, must be taken up (Eph. 6:13-18)
- 2. Your labor of love
- Love-agape—the love of God not known by the world (1 Cor. 13:4-8a)
- What this tells me is putting genuine God-love into action is not going to be easy, may bring grief and hardship yet we must try
- 3. Your patience of hope (Tit. 2:13, 3:7; John 16:33)
- Patience- to persevere, remain under, bear up under endurance to things or circumstances (different from 1 Cor. 13:4 which is longsuffering toward people)
- Hope-desire for some good with expectation of obtaining it especially in regards to salvation and Christ's return

Titus 2:13 (NKJV) *looking for the blessed hope and glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ,*

B. How?

- 1. In the Lord Jesus Christ
- 2. In the sight of God the Father (2 Cor. 5:10; Luke 21:36)
- Sight—before, in front of, ahead, in the presence or sight of,
 - **2 Corinthians 5:10 (NKJV)** For we must all appear <u>before</u> the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things done in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad.
- 3. Because of your election in God (Elect—all believers—Isa. 45:4; Rom. 11:5-7; Col. 3:12)
- Elect is not just Israel (as in the Old Testament) but now those redeemed by the Lamb—Jew and Gentile in Christ Jesus
 - **Colossians 3:12 (NKJV)** Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering;
- Election is based on what one does with Jesus Christ—those who accept are elect those who refuse Him are not elect (John 1:12-13)

IV. Challenge—to live as a church

- These are tough admonitions of appreciation by the apostles to the church then and now
 - o It requires genuine repentance from sin and the first Adam nature
 - o It requires allowing the Holy Spirit who dwells in every true believer to have full sway over our lives
 - o It requires being willing to live dependent on God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ in full submission to Him
