The Chairman's Report

Ladies and Gentlemen.

Once again I am pleased to report that the Portuguese Podengo Club has had another successful year.

The year started with the Podengo appearing in the Import Classes at Championship and Open Shows in the U.K. What a successful year it has been for the breed in these classes, with the very large entries and top wins this has really put our breed into the limelight. British Podengos showing abroad also attained some of the highest awards possible for the breed. Now with more publicity and therefore more interest in the breed I am sure the Podengo will continue to flourish. Unfortunately, as with any new breed, there are always people who are very plausible, who want to jump on the 'bandwagon' of a new breed and because they have not achieved anything else in dogs (and there are those that claim falsely that they have done big things in other breeds), think a new minority breed will make them important or famous, or they can make money from the dogs rarity, sadly some of these people have already arrived in the Podengo breed and shown their true colours, and so in future we must be more vigilant to whom we let our puppies go to. The Club held three days for members in 2006 firstly a Companion Dog Show in May, but the weather was against us and therefore this was not very well attended. The Fun Day was held in September, and was very enjoyable for those that came; sadly this also had a low attendance. Finally, the Annual Match which was kindly judged by Mr. Terry Thorn, this was held in November further north, near Daventry, this was because we tried to accommodate the members from the north, sadly this was also not very well attended, and it was particularly noticeable that the northern members did not attend, and we lost a lot of our southern members who felt it was too far to travel.

This will have to be addressed in the coming year, as we cannot afford to lose our faithful southern members, who previously have supported us so well. The Club sent out a questionnaire to ask the members what they would really like the club to organise, this only had a few replies, so we can only presume that the general membership is happy with what we are doing at present. However, there will be no point in organising Club days unless we get supported, as the club cannot afford to risk making a loss in the future on the days organised for the membership. The Club sent out Newsletters with Lesley Tomlinson as Editor, which were well received, and I would like to thank Lesley for the work, time and effort put into this publication.

The only Book on the Portuguese Podengo, which has been translated into English, appeared during 2006, this book was up-dated from the original Portuguese version, and is a very good publication, with a lot of history of the breed. As there are only 1,000 copies of this book published worldwide, it will certainly become a collector's item.

Podengos appeared at Discover Dogs in London in November, and this was under the control of Nigel and Jennifer Folds, as I was away at the World Dog Show. Sadly, they were virtually left to do everything on their own, as nobody else was able, for one reason or another to assist them. However, when it came to Discover Dogs at Crufts, everyone seemed to want to assist, and we had too many offering to help on certain days. Later this year I hope all these people wanting to help at Crufts will be available to assist in London. I would like to give a very special thank you to Nigel and Jennifer Folds, for their enormous help the Podengo Booths at both Discover Dogs Events, without them there would have been no Podengos in London in November, and I could have not managed without their help at Crufts. I would also like to thank all the other helpers at these events.

The All about Dogs Event was held in May in Essex, and the Podengo was represented for the first time, this was manned by Eileen Segui and Paul Day and helpers, and I understand this was a success, thank you to all those who helped. These "Showcase" opportunities are very important for any new breed, and it is important that whoever is manning and advising the public on these days are people that own the Podengo, not just dog people, otherwise there is no point in being there. Podengo owners are the best advisors and are essential to advise potential future owners of this breed.

Registrations continue to rise, with 108 registrations in 2006, bringing total registrations up to 251 since recognition, with some more litters already having been born in 2007. Our application for transfer from the Import Register to the Breed Register was sent to the Kennel Club in May, and we are awaiting this application to be discussed as soon as the Kennel Club can put it on the Agenda, which bearing in mind the time lapse, should not be too much longer.

Sadly, we lose Wendy Mooney as Treasurer this year, due to her work pressure at home; she has decided to stand down. I would like to give Wendy a special thank you for all the hard work she has done to get this club started, and she leaves us with a healthy bank balance for the next Treasurer to take over. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the Officers and Committee for their support, hard work and commitment during the past 12 months and look forward to working with them again into 2008, for the benefit of the Portuguese Podengo in the U.K. Betty Judge.

Ilt has been a very good year for the Podengo in the fact that they hit the import register with a bang, and continue to do so, growing in numbers and strength.

On the Club front, it has been a mixed year. We had the companion show last year which was held in the middle of the most rainy & windy two weeks of the year. This unfortunately took its toll on the entries and we made a loss on the day. Next was the Fun Day which started out wet, but was a lovely day, if a bit windy but again we lost out in numbers. The Match was our next event with Terry Thorn presiding, and although it was a good day that everyone enjoyed, we were struggling with the entries and there should have been a lot more support. The Club hold these events for the members and put a lot of hard work and effort into holding them. It is very disappointing when we don't get the positive feedback.

A questionnaire was sent to the members to try and find out what they wanted from the Club, but from the 4 that we had back, the events asked for were Fun Days, Matches & Companion shows, all of which we have held each year.

We will be holding a Judging Seminar for would be judges and are in the process of compiling criteria for the Judges List. Hopefully it won't be too long before we have our own classes and we need to be up and running with the Judges List so it is essential that we start as soon as possible. A big thank you to all the Committee & Officers of the Club for their work and commitment during the year. Lets hope that the Podengo community will have a good 2007 and best of luck to you all. The Treasurer's Report

These are my third and final accounts for the Podengo Club as this is my last year as Treasurer. I have found that my family life has become ever more demanding and it makes it very difficult to attend and support the Club in the way that I would like.

I am happy to say that I leave the Club on a sound financial footing and I wish my successor well. I am sure that she will do an excellent job for the Club and I am happy to give her any continuing support and assistance over the coming months to make a smooth changeover.

I am pleased to report that the Club made a healthy profit in 2006 of £1,292.69. This is principally due to continuing support from the member's renewing their subscriptions and a steady flow of new members. The membership stands at around 150 currently. Every year we lose some members but, as Podengos are growing in popularity and the interest in the breed is increasing all the time, we are continually getting new members joining.

The breed has a large number of enthusiasts following its progress. This of course has been helped by its appearance in the ring at both open and championship level with not insignificant numbers being shown all over the country.

The club held 3 events in 2006. Unfortunately all were poorly attended by the members. We were however able to make modest profits on 2 of these and the 3rd, the Companion Dog Show just broke even. This is very disappointing for the committee, who worked very hard to put on events for the club, giving their time freely and generally donating much in the way of prizes and catering. The Fun Day was held in September. Betty Judge kindly allowed her premises to be used to hold this event and therefore all income on the day was profit. Other committee members donated prizes and food and hence there were no expenses incurred by the club. It was extremely disappointing that only a few people managed to make it on the day but those who came had a lovely time. The profit on the day was from thee raffle and entries to the games and amounted to £233.20.

Events are held for 2 reasons. The first is to give back something to the members, allowing them an opportunity to meet fellow Podengo enthusiasts, to see other Podengos in the UK and to have an occasion to air their Pods (particularly for those not interested in showing at open and championship shows).

The second reason is to raise money for the Club. In total the 3 events made a profit for the club of £410.84.

The club purchased some rubber matting during the year. These will be used at future Club matches and shows to allow the dogs and handlers to move around the ring without slipping. The bank accounts are both in a healthy state with £405.78 in the current account and £3,927.85 in the deposit account at the end of the year.

The stock of club items has been kept to a minimum as many items are made to order by Lesley Tomlinson. The sale of such items plus club badges made £286.18 for the club in 2006.

Debtors at the end of the year are mostly cheques paid by members for adverts in the latest Pod Post and for some club items purchased towards the end of the year. These were banked at the start of 2007.

The creditor figure of £395.51 is mostly due for the cost of printing and posting of the Pod Posts. Again this has since been paid off in 2007.

I am sorry that I could not attend the meeting in person but I had other commitments today which prevent me being with you.

I would just like to thank the committee for all their support over the last 3½ years. I wish the club all the best for the future and I will watch the Podengos' progress with interest.

Rabies checks 'too restrictive'

The UK government's chief vet and chief scientific adviser have told BBC News that current rabies controls in Britain are overly restrictive.

Both officials are involved in a review of the issue to assess whether current regulations should be relaxed.

This would bring them into line with other EU countries.

Pressure for a rethink came about because the UK's dispensation for extra controls over and above those of the EU runs out next year.

The controls... actually may be more than is necessary to achieve the level of protection that we want

Dr Debby Reynolds - It is not that long ago that fears of rabies arriving in the UK meant that dogs travelling back from Europe had to be kept in quarantine.

Now the Pet Travel Scheme allows owners to vaccinate their dogs and confirm it with a blood test six months before travel. It is a more humane system - but still complex and rigid for many pet owners. Each year, many of them have to cancel holiday plans because they did not know the system well enough.

Available evidence

The government's chief veterinary officer, Dr Debby Reynolds, told BBC News that she believed the current system was more than was needed to keep the UK rabies-free.

PET TRAVEL SCHEME (PETS)

EU introduced its European pet movement regulation in 2004

The 'passport' system allows pets to move between countries

Animals are tagged with a chip and vaccinated against rabies

A blood test confirms the presence of antibodies

Tick and tapeworm treatments needed before entering UK

Documentation and chip will be checked at borders

Technical differences between countries can be confusing

She said: "Our scientific conclusions do suggest that the controls themselves are precautionary; that they actually may be more than is necessary to achieve the level of protection that we want."

It is a view that is backed up by the government's chief scientific adviser, Professor Sir David King: "I've reviewed all the available evidence and I agree that the current restrictions are too precautionary.

"There's a case to consider bringing our rules more in line with other European Union countries."

Within Europe, animals can travel between countries 21 days after vaccination. Dr Reynolds and Professor King have been asked to advise ministers on the issue. They say that there has been a dramatic decline of rabies in western Europe. They also say that it is possible to tell within three rather than six - months whether a dog is carrying rabies.

Most animal welfare groups agree the current system is too severe. But Chris Lawrence of the Dogs Trust believes that it would be wrong to bring the waiting time down to 21 days after vaccination.

There's no reason why we should change the current situation to suit the rest of the EU "Rabies is prevalent in Poland, Eastern Europe and many accession countries and by harmonising our regulations, [we] would increase the risk of rabies arriving in the UK," he said.

"A three-month waiting period is supported by the science - and separate blood tests should continue to be required because one can't be completely sure of all vaccine stocks."

Sultan's Travel Notes.

2006 was a very busy year for Sultan as he was entered in more than 35 shows and exhibited in 29 of them in 6 different countries. At the end of 2006, Sultan earned 3 tickets in Holland, 3 tickets in France including a specialty, 3 stars in Ireland (15 in the old system), 1 ticket in Luxembourg, 2 tickets in Belgium and numerous class wins here in the UK along with 2 Reserve Best Import Register. He also picked up CACIB's in 4 countries. Along the way, he also picked up the following titles: Celtic Jr. Winner 2006, Belgium Winner 2006

and in Amsterdam, the Winners title for 2006. Sultan's sons made him proud at the club match in November picking up 1st and 2nd in the Puppy walk under Mr. Thorn.

2007 will be easier for Sultan as we scale back on his events since I have been teaching Secondary Science full time this year I just don't have the energy or time to get to that many events. With this in mind, we selected various events that Sultan needed to finish his various Championships.

In January Sultan and the boys were exhibited at Manchester Champ show where Sultan won open, Bounce went second behind Eileen's excellent Carlos in puppy and Ham won Junior dog. Ham went on to best Sultan in the challenge by taking Reserve Best import Register.

In March, Sultan traveled to Belgium where he picked up his 3rd CAC at Wieze (Aalst). He really enjoyed himself and put on a tremendous performance both in the breed and group ring.

In April, we traveled to Luxembourg where Sultan competed against a Portuguese Import in Open and against a French born dog in Intermediate where he earned the CACL. Then he was awarded the CACIB and competed against a Portuguese Import German Champion bitch for Best of Breed. He had to work hard as the judge kept him in the ring throughout so he had to stay on his toes. Sultan worked very hard and pulled off his 12th Best of Breed win while picking up his Luxembourg Championship! This is our first ever Championship so we were both very excited.

The following weekend we headed over to Ireland where Sultan earned his 4th Green star. CACIB and his 13th Best of Breed. Vitor Veiga was at the show and he spoke with me as I was

leaving to compliment Sultan and express his disappointment with the group selections.

Two days later Sultan's sons were exhibited at Dunstable & District canine society open show in Keysoe. There was a good entry of 14 with 5 being Podengos. I asked my daughter to help me handle, as it would be her first time in the ring with a Podengo. She has handled GSD's for me in the past but showing a big dog is very different than showing a small one. We practiced a bit before going into the ring so she'd have a basic idea of what to expect. She handled Bounce in a large puppy class and managed to come in 3rd even though she wasn't sure how to get him performing to his best. I handled Ham and he placed first in a large Junior class, then he went on to Reserve Best import Register.

Hopefully by mid summer, Sultan will have completed his other National Championships. We plan to start training in Agility once he's done in the show ring so he can add to his accomplishments in 2008.
