With over 6 years of education focused in architecture, and over 15 years of experience in the field, she is continually developing her professional skills and knowledge. Amy's passion and the majority of her experience is in designing custom homes. Even though Single-Family Residential projects are her expertise, through past professional experience, Amy has practiced in the following market sectors as well: Urban Development, Medical Office, Commercial Office, Restaurant, Retail, Mixed-Use development, Theme Park development, and Multi-Family Residential. Private Residence. Custom single-family residence. A modern design where aesthetics and function merge to embody the program, style, and key concepts desired by the family who will call this place home. Embellished by inspiration from the family's professional trade and lifestyle, this home features the expression of structural elements through artfully executed, poured-in-place, architectural concrete features. The use of light wells, a living vegetation wall, water features, and floor-to-ceiling windows allow the incorporation of light, vegetation, and water as a design element providing a connection to the calming and peaceful beauty of the surrounding natural environment, capturing lake views throughout the home. The continuation of design elements between the interior and exterior spaces extends the concept of spatial boundaries beyond the confines of the building envelope, blurring the lines between interior and exterior spaces. The cantilevered treads surrounded by glass at the main stair, the glass floor bridge passing above the entry foyer, the glazed openings at the bottom of the elevated pool, and the proximity of the water surface to the living surface provide a sense of adventure and excitement throughout the public spaces of the home. All while providing functional living space for the family and the entertainment of their guests. At 9,384 sq. ft. A/C area, 13,961 sq. ft. total constructed area, this is a 3-story home with 6 bedrooms and 8 bathrooms. Beyond the features described above and the typical rooms you would expect in any home, this home also includes a gym, den, scullery with walk-in cooler, catering kitchen, dumb waiter, elevator, dog wash station, and garage parking for up to 6 vehicles.

<u>Private Residence</u>. Custom single-family residence. This home is designed in a Transitional style, more specifically it is a blend of bold modern forms with traditional mediterranean forms without the typical embellishments but with modern aesthetic in material selections and detailing throughout. This home features a winding landscaped driveway as you enter the property, framed views across the pool to the lake beyond, an interior walkway bridge elevated over an exterior water feature that flows from the front of the house to the rear, glass stair tower with steel framed staircase. At 5,689 sq. ft. A/C area, 8,711 sq. ft. total constructed area, this home is a 2-story home with 4 bedroom suites (including the primary bedroom suite); 4 full bathrooms, 2 half bathrooms, a study; a great

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room to include a family room, kitchen w/ hidden pantry, & dining area; an upstairs guest living space; an outdoor living area with summer kitchen and pizza oven, and attached garages with parking for up to 4 cars.

Private Residence. Custom single-family residence. This home is designed in the Modern Farm style to suit the bustling needs of a successful CEO, the active lifestyle of his beautiful family, and their guests. The home features an indoor partial court basketball gym, a theater room, a lounge/den, private guest suite, private study, and outdoor pavilion. At 8,460 sq. ft. A/C area, 13,932 sq. ft. total constructed area, this one story, single-family home includes 4 bedroom suites (including the primary bedroom suite & private guest suite); 4 full bathrooms, 2 half bathrooms, great room to include: family room, kitchen w/ pantry, and dining area; covered patio, summer kitchen, and attached garages with parking for up to 8 cars.


