With over 6 years of education focused in architecture, and over 12 years of experience in the field, she is continually developing her professional skills and knowledge. Amy’s passion and the majority of her experience is in designing custom homes. Even though Single-Family Residential projects are her expertise, through internships and professional experience, Amy has practiced in the following market sectors as well: Urban Development, Medical Office, Commercial Office, Restaurant, Retail, Mixed-Use development, Theme Park development, and Multi-Family Residential. Her approach is to help guide her clients through the various stages of design; provide them with a set of documents for use with financing, selecting and hiring a contractor, as well as permitting; and be available to assist with questions and advise as the building takes form.

Amy’s project experience at Nasrallah Architectural Group, Inc. allowed her to participate in 50 + custom residential projects over the years. She has worked on projects for corporate CEOs, professional athletes, and many other hard working families. These homes ranged in size from 3,500 sq.ft. to 33,000 sq.ft. She also participated in some highly customized commercial projects as well. The most notable projects from her time at Nasrallah Architectural Group, Inc. include:

Private Residence. Custom 33,000 sq.ft. single-family residence. This home is designed in the Neoclassical style to suit both the entertainment needs, as well as, the family life needs of the client. The home features a grand entertainment space with supporting catering kitchen, gaming room, home theater, indoor 2-lane bowling alley, indoor half-court basketball gym; family level with Master suite, private studio, and all the expected program features of a single-family residence; and upper level with 5 private bedroom suites. The site plan features terraced lawns, outdoor swimming pool and spa, cabana house with massage parlor and salon. The site and home are designed to be completely handicap accessible.

Private Residence. Custom 19,000 sq.ft. single-family residence. This home is designed in a New England Country Estate style to suit the growing needs of a young entrepreneurial family. This home is set in the beautiful rolling hills of Central Florida amongst sprawling oaks and beautiful green pastures. With 5 bedroom suites including the master, a children’s study/game room, a private study and lounge, outdoor living area and loggias, an 8 car garage for the client’s private collection, the residence maintains a spacious yet cozy feel through the main body of the home.

Margla Urban Center, Santa Cruz, Bolivia. This project for Miller Legg involved planning a 10 acre site for the development of a life style center. Amy was one of the Architectural Designers responsible for preliminary site development drawings, and site development capacity analysis.

Luxury Villa Development, China. This project involved the design and development of a neighborhood of (14)10,000 sq.ft. luxury villas, as well as (1)40,000 sq. ft. villa. Amy was the Project Manager and Architectural Designer responsible for client coordination and on-site visit, architectural style research and definition, image and architectural mood boards for all villas, design and development packages for (3)10,000 sq. ft. villas, and document checking and coordination of all villa packages.

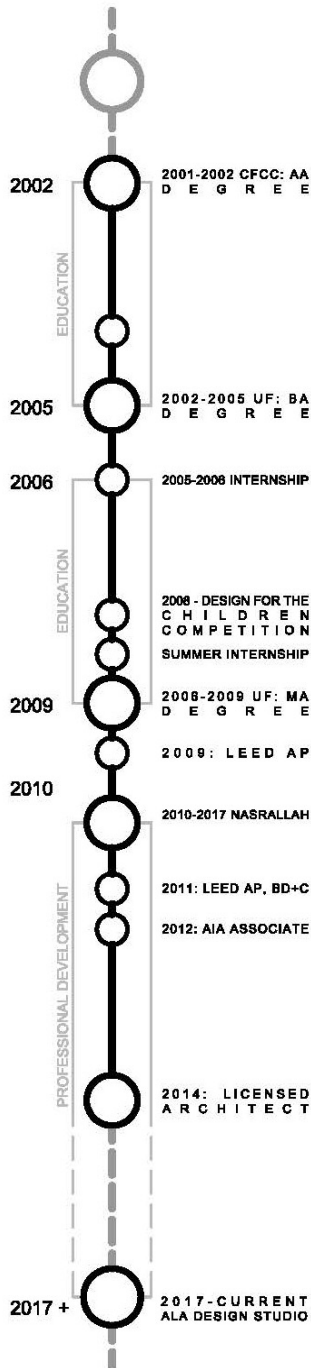
