Jaron's home Supervisorial District in Tuolumne County is nearly two to one Republican. Jaron has won this district twice – including with 59.4 percent in 2020 where he defeated the two-term Republican incumbent by nearly 20 points in a head to head match up. Jaron was safely reelected in 2024 without a runoff, taking 57.5 percent of the vote in the March Primary.

From roads to public safety, housing and homelessness, wildfire and opioid addiction, he's never been afraid to take on the most difficult issues for his community and produce results.
