Due to Karen Pihera resigning from the Board, we have two options since it was already voted on to approve reduction from 9 to 7 board positions:

- 1. Special appointment from the at-large membership.
- 2. Do not fill the position therefore reducing the number to the 7 which does follow the bylaws.

Motion made by Cathie Kindler to leave at 7 not fill the position, motion seconded, passed unanimously.

SSLA 2017 Board of Directors Meeting, March 16, 2018, continued

Topic: Treasurer's Report

Discussion: Kathy Devaul

Profit and Loss Report Submitted and reviewed by Board. Some history and accounting became difficult after the unexpected loss of the previous Treasurer. PayPal gave us 3 pages of transactions. But not broken out 'correctly'? The losses that 'showed up' may not have been in the correct categories. 90-100 transactions, needed to 'finish' to get the taxes done. Put the 'unknown' transactions into Membership, may not have been accurate? And some of these transactions may have been in 2016. Had auction in March, but didn't Transfer to scholarship was in October. Same issue with Regional shows to main account, so there is a 'profit' that will show up in 2016 vs 2017 vs 2018. \$3,000+ for wrapping trailer, almost \$4,000. So those amounts wash when added back to show, but because of 'problems' with accounting the balance is correct it is just an issue of what categories the monies came in from.

Last year we were at a similar account balance. The pattern seems to be showing the same. Sometimes Up/Down, but consistent. We may need to have fund raisers. We are not growing, but we aren't really losing either. Outstanding are Board Insurance, Sweepstakes bills, outstanding expenses for Conference, but it 'seems' that we are breaking even. Having Vicki doing website is saving us money. We need to grow membership to make the proportions go down per member.

Old Business

Topic: Elections

Action: The election was done again by Simply Voting. The system was easy to use and accurate in reporting. Vicki Sundberg was the Inspector of Elections. 29 farms voted out of a potential 36. Greg Hall, Kathy Devaul, and Lauri Jones were elected to the Board. Vicki Sundberg will present and introduce the Board and Officers at the Annual Meeting.

Topic: Website

Action: Webmaster resigned in January, Vicki Sundberg, who is the Website Chairperson, picked it up very well. Using GoDaddy, the 'cross over' went very well. We are looking to have a private/members only section, but not up yet. Vicki will present website information at the Annual Meeting.

Topic: Show

Kathy Devaul reported the show year has done well leaving a comfortable balance in the show account as well as being able to give back the General Fund. Kathy will report at the Annual Meeting.

Topic: Scholarship

Tom Rothering reports that we will add Lauren Wright for signature. Keeping account where it is and need sign off by Board Members to approve. Leave in Washington, GA (small bank). Janessa Hall, Hunter Williams, Candice Snow are current, no one in 2018, and then Bailey Jones and several others in 2019. We have criteria, and those are being kept up-to-date. Tom Rothering will present at the Annual Meeting.

Topic: Membership

Cheryl Lambert reports we are down again this year. There is a total of 55 farms, 46 renewals, 4 new members, 5 lifetime members. Last year at this time we had 70 members and ended the year with 77. In 2016 total membership was 87.

Click, Treat & Train and Enjoy the Results!

The more I work with my llamas, the more I thank for something every trainer I ever met.

I thank Marty McGee for catch-rope haltering and the no-pressure handling techniques, especially for legs. I thank John Mallon for the idea of rewarding llamas by my absence. But most of all, I thank Jim and Amy Logan for the Click & RewardTM technique that makes my llamas eager to be trained.

Click & RewardTM is the Logans' term for an operant training technique that uses only positive reinforcement. This technique was first conceived in the 1940's by behaviorist B.F. Skinner and has been used since that time by many types of animal trainers, including those training dolphins and other marine mammals. We think training a llama can be challenging, but how do you train an animal that can just swim away from you? Believe me, this technique works with dolphins, and it works equally well with not only llamas, but all of the animals that are trained to "act" in movies and on television. This is a powerful technique, but basically very simple.

Click, Treat & Train uses a clicker as a signal to the animal that he has done something right. It is an exact time marker, so that the animal has no doubt regarding what is being rewarded. The click is always followed by a reward. A bit of the llama's regular ration is a good treat. The challenge from the trainer's perspective is to become accurate enough with the clicker so that he is rewarding the behavior that he wants, and not the behavior that precedes or follows the correct behavior. A split second can make the difference. Practice is essential for good results.

I first used clicker training with a llama that wanted to jump the fence and run away anytime his owner entered any size enclosure with him. Within a few sessions over the course of two or three weeks, he was standing in the stall for haltering. The results were most astounding to me.

The 4-H'ers in the Carolina Cria Club sponsored by Saluda Farms have been using clicker training to train their llamas. We have seen impressive results with haltering by young 9 and 10 year old 4-H'ers. One of our older members was given the challenge of working with a llama notorious for kicking. Over the course of now too very long, the llama was tolerating touching and grooming of back legs.

I like to work with some of our more difficult llamas in order to eliminate undesirable behaviors, such as spitting or kicking. With Click, Treat & Train, the best way to eliminate undesirable behaviors is to teach an incompatible behavior, so they can't do both the desired behavior and spit or kick at the same time. It is really wonderful to see this kind of progress.

It is amazing how the sound of the clicker becomes a positive communication to the llamas. Recently two of our llamas who had been away from "home" for about six months returned for breeding. The new owner obviously had a fine relationship with the llamas and frequently hand-fed them, but he did not consistently clicker train. Although he would feed when he was getting behavior he wanted, he didn't include the clicker. Observing some difficulty in haltering, I used the clicker to halter the younger one, and it was as if a light switch had been turned on. It was obvious that this was a sound that she remembered and enjoyed. I am, using the brief opportunity of having her back "home" to work on her training. It is far from an instant solution, but it is certainly a positive way to improve the haltering scenario.

This is the fun part of the interaction with the llamas. They enjoy the training, and that makes it fun and rewarding for all of us.
