

## HISTORY OF DISCOVER LLAMAS

In 1991, Liliane Grant and Greta Carsten edited a brochure called “Dixie Llama Jamboree” to be distributed to interested public at the first llama show and exhibition at the Georgia National Fair in Perry, Georgia.

The following two years, Tracy Pearson edited “Why Llamas” for the Perry show and to be distributed to llama ranches across the country.

In 1994, the publication was re-named “Discover Llamas” and was produced by the SSLA for more widespread distribution to SSLA members and at llama shows throughout the southeast.

In 2001 it was decided to produce “Discover Llamas” every two years rather than annually.

In 2006, the magazine also started making its appearance at the National FFA Convention attended by over 50,000 people.
