

## Remember This....Showmanship Tips

by Carolyn Blalock/March 2000

(With excerpts from the 11th Edition of the ALSA Handbook)

## • Exhibitors should encourage their animals to walk out briskly on a slack line.

- Exhibitors should be careful to leave a safe distance between animals, never crowding or coming in contact with others.
- Always lead your llama from the left side, holding the lead in your right hand.
- The remaining portion of the lead should be held in a figure 8 coil in your left hand.
- At no time should the lead be coiled around the hand.
- When lining up, stand or set up your animal squarely on all four feet. Recognize quickly and correct positioning faults of your animal.
- When standing face your llama at a 45-degree angle off its left shoulder.
- If necessary, you may move smoothly to the other side of the animal. (Never stand or lead from directly in front of the llama.)
- When asked to move out of the lineup to the judge, walk straight towards the judge. If required to stop and square your animal up, come to a stop 18'-24' in front of the judge.
- When turning your llama, always turn from the right (unless it's 1/4 or less). Plan your turns so the llama's hind feet are nearly in place when turning (haunch turn or pivot).
- If asked to change positions in line, leave your space by walking forward and clear of the line; turn to the right (into your animal); go back through your space in the line and clear the line again; turn right (into your animal) again and proceed behind the line to your new place and square up

#### Why?

This results in a free and natural gait that reflects the animal's soundness & conformation.

Crowding the animal in front of you impacts the way your llama moves out and can also cause problems with the animal in front of you.

Most people are right-handed, which means this should give you better control of your llama.

Holding the excess lead this way keeps it from dangling and looks neater.

This is a safety hazard. If the animal should bolt, the handler could be seriously hurt.

This gives the judge the best view of the llama's conformation in a standing position.

You should always be in a position where you can see both your llama and the judge.

This allows the judge an unobstructed view of the llama.

This gives the judge the best opportunity to get a good look at the animal in motion from the front. Coming all the way up to the judge is both courteous and good showmanship.

This puts the llama on the inside of the turn. It keeps the turn collected and safe. The llama steps out of the turn in a straight line, allowing the judge to effectively view the back end in motion.

This has the least impact on the rest of the lineup. It also does not obstruct the judge's view of the rest of the lineup while you're moving. It looks clean and professional.

## Remember This....Showmanship Tips continued

## Be natural. Avoid loud voice commands and unnecessary discipline.

- Dress neatly and conservatively.
- No open-toed shoes.
- Be courteous and sportsmanlike at all times. Treat others as you would like to be treated yourself in the ring.

#### Why?

Over-showing, undue fussing and maneuvering are objectionable and distracting to the judge.

You want to look professional. At the same time you want the judge to be looking at your animal, not you.

This is for safety.

To be otherwise does not benefit yourself or your animal.
